
Dear Ms. Dortch:

This *ex parte* letter is written on behalf of the Community Broadcasters Association ("CBA"), the trade association of the nation's Class A and Low Power Television Stations.

On July 26, 2004, the U.S. GPS Industry Council ("Council") filed an *ex parte* letter suggesting a compromise involving the use of filters to control out-of-band emissions that might adversely affect the reception and use of Global Position System signals.

On July 30, 2004, the National Translator Association ("NTA") filed an *ex parte* letter recommending that the Commission adopt the Council's request and specifying the provisions that should be included in the Commission's Rules.

This letter is to advise the Commission that CBA has consulted with NTA regarding this matter, and CBA concurs with NTA's position and recommendation.
