

This e-mail is to oppose any FCC requirement which would require broadcasters to make and retain recordings of programming for a certain period of time. Our radio stations have never received a complaint related to indecency and we request the Commission not unfairly burden radio stations such as ours to go to the time and expense to record our programming. We are responsible broadcasters and our small six person full-time staff works hard to serve the public each day with local news, public service, and public affairs programming. We are already stretched very thin most days multi-tasking various responsibilities and do not have the manpower to do the proposed recording process. Like most small market stations located in a conservative rural region of the United States, we're under daily marketplace pressures to maintain respectful family friendly programming and we'd never economically survive any attempt to air indecent programming.
