This is to advise that on September 1, 2004, the undersigned and Terry G. Mahn, on behalf of Powerwave Technologies, Inc., met with Roger Noel, Loyd Coward, Jay Jackson and Wilbert Nixon of the Mobility Division of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau to discuss Powerwave's comments and reply comments in the above-referenced Docket.

We reiterated Powerwave's position that the Commission should amend Section 24.232(a) to eliminate the transmitter power requirement and further clarify that each PCS carrier be permitted an EIRP level of 1640 Watts. We further stated that while Powerwave has no objection to the adoption of a power spectral density standard, for narrowband PCS systems, any such standard must permit at least the equivalent of 1640 watts per carrier.

We also suggested that, in the absence of a transmitter power limit, PCS base station amplifiers could be certificated by determining that at their rated power, emissions were within the out-of-band emission limits in the rules.
