Pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Commission's Rules, this is to advise you that on Wednesday, September 8, 2004, Carl Vogel, President and CEO of Charter Communications, Curtis S. Shaw, Executive Vice President and General Counsel of Charter; Willie Epps, Vice President Management Services of Charter; Paul Glist of Cole, Raywid & Braverman; and Al Mottur of Brownstein Hyatt Farber, met with Commissioner Kevin J. Martin and Daniel Gonzalez of Commissioner Martin's Office. We discussed the position of Charter filed in the ongoing rulemaking proceeding regarding IP-enabled communications. We discussed Charter's willingness to assume certain key responsibilities as a VoIP provider, such as the availability of 911 service and meeting CALEA requirements, and the importance of having a unified national regulatory framework for VoIP services that entails only light regulation.
