Dr. Mark Cooper met with Commissioner Kathleen Abernathy and Jennifer Warren and Matthew Brill and described the Petition to Deny the Application by Cingular to Acquire AT&T Wireless licenses for spectrum filed by the Consumer Federation of America and Consumers Union. Dr. Cooper stressed the fact that in light of the collapse of CLEC competition in the wake of the decision not to appeal the TRO, a merger that produces a dominant wireless-wireline combination poses a special threat to competition.
