On behalf of South Carolina's Farm Bureau, I write in support of the merger of Cingular Wireless and AT&T Wireless. We believe this merger will be good for competition, and particularly good for rural consumers.

We understand that a number of leading independent rural wireless carriers have already formally voiced their support of this transaction. Like those carriers, we anticipate a number of benefits from the combining of these two companies. Some of those benefits include expanded wireless coverage, particularly into rural areas, and the rapid deployment of high speed data services.
