As a resident of Fairbanks, Alaska and a listener to K-LOVE radio (88.5), I would urge you not to allow low power radio stations (LPFM) to take priority over current FM providers.

My whole family listens to K\_LOVE, including my two teenage children living at home. As a parent, I greatly value having their station available for my kids. It also provides my wife and I some enjoyable listening.

Fairbanks is a small community (85,000 people) in the interior part of Alaska. As such, it would be difficult to have a programming like that of K-LOVE if the costs of that service were only borne by local listeners.....two few listeners to justify the expense. That's why the K-LOVE model makes sense.

Without question, K-LOVE service is in the public interest and it's hard to see why the FCC would consider taking this service away. In Alaska and the nation as a whole, we are desperately trying to give America's youth something positive.....this is it. The business model makes sense and I support its continuation.
