I am a supporter of K-LOVE, a contemporary Christian radio station currently broadcast nationally using FM translator service. It has come to my attention that the FCC is currently considering expanding Low Power FM broadcast services and that this expansion would be to the detriment of the current FM translator services. That being so, I urge you to reconsider the expansion of the LPFM services.

K-LOVE is currently the only contemporary Christian radio station offered in the Memphis area. It is a station that both me and my teenage son enjoy together, and helps unite us through music, which all too often today separates teens and their parents rather than unites them. And you surely must agree that anything that keeps parents and teens positively communicating is a good thing, for both the individual family and the community as a whole.

K-LOVE is listener supported financially and as a monthly contributor, I feel a vital interest in seeing what is actually a ministry to the community continue. I know I can tune to this station any time of the day or night and I will not hear anything obscene, profane or offensive, which is just not true of the majority of radio stations out there today. Many seem to delight in just how far they can push the envelope in that area. We need alternatives for our young people and community, and K-LOVE provides that. And they manage to do that without commercial advertisements or government grants or assistance.
