Dear Sir or Madam:

I oppose the proposition to expand the broadcast service LPFM because it would have the potential to eliminate our favorite FM service K-Love which is broadcast over FM translators. K-Love provides a unique and important service to our community. There is no shortage of PBS, hip-hop, talk radio, all the variations of "rock" but there is only one station that offers contemporary Christian music. People of all ages are having their lives enriched and are encouraged by K-Love to live better than the world around them, while many other stations encourage people to sink to the basest levels.

If any of you who read this are over 45 or 50 years old, you will remember when society encouraged such virtues as chastity, sobriety, abstinence from drugs, good citizenship, personal achievement, patriotism, integrity, etc. That list could go on, but I believe you understand where I am coming from. Today our young people are encouraged in the opposite direction, not only by the seedier elements of our society, but also by our public educators, by their sports heroes, by their idols in the entertainment industry.

If the K-Love message touches just one young heart to stay off drugs, or one teenage girl to practice abstinence (which prevents unwanted pregnancies, and the spread of STDs) or to encourage one struggling family to not give up, or one young man not to drop out of school, won't our society be that much better? Isn't that the kind of society that is in the public interest

If K-Love is replaced by any other kind of station, our community will suffer because K-Love is Unique. K-Love fills a void that no other station fills.
