**Re: Response to Comment on Low Power FM Broadcast Service
MB Docket No. 04-233**

To Whom It May Concern:

In response to FCC MB Docket No. 04-233 concerning the FCC Comment on Low Power FM Broadcast Service (“LPFM”), we would like to register our comments and concerns. We are residents of Chicago, Illinois and regular listeners of K-LOVE on FM radio. K-LOVE provides the residents of the Chicago area with access to music of a Christian contemporary format as well as relevant and timely news coverage on topics of interest to this community.

If the Chicago metropolitan area were to be deprived of access to the K-LOVE FM radio station due to the placement of priority on LPFM stations, the community would be completely denied access to music of a Christian contemporary format. While some local stations broadcast music in this format, none of the stations have the signal reach as does K-LOVE, which means that certain communities within the Chicago metropolitan area, such as the community in which our family resides, are not within a clear signal of any of those local FM radio stations.

K-LOVE and other similar national and regional services provide an invaluable service not only to residents of the Chicago metropolitan community but also to residents similarly situated in communities throughout the United States. As a result, we would request that the FCC not permit LPFM to take priority over national and regional services such as K-LOVE.
