Local Newscasts and Key Stories

WJW airs **41.5** hours of local news each week, at the following times:

Monday – Friday, 10 p.m. – 11 p.m.

Sunday, 8 a.m. – 9 a.m.

Provided below is a brief summary of important local news segments and stories that WJW has covered recently within its broadcasts:

- * **COMMUNITY ISSUES** *Fox 8 News in the Morning* airs Monday-Friday from 5am until 9am. During the 7am & 8am hours we often produce in-Studio segments that offer Northeast Ohioians timely information about issues affecting their community. The service these segments provide is often two fold: the segment publicizes a community event and at the same time provides information about a topic that affects the community. We get so many requests for publicity from non-profit groups in Northeast Ohio that this is one effective way of helping them while providing entertainment and information to our viewers.
- * **SCHOOL CLOSINGS** During the year the station provides a school closing service to over 3,000 schools in a viewing area that includes over 930 cities. The station is the "Official School Closing Station." The service covers closings and delays and is the largest and most self-reliant system in Northeast Ohio, featuring main and back-up computer servers. The most successful and longest running system in the area, it is maintained 24 hours a day, seven days a week. School closings run on the air during 7 1/2 hours of daily news and on the weekends when necessary.
- * **PET ADOPTIONS** Since May 1980 the Chief Meteorologist, Dick Goddard, has been an advocate for dogs and cats. Once a week a taped pet segment runs at 6 pm. Five to six animals that are available for adoption are shown on the air. A phone number is also given for viewers interested in adopting the animals. During the year over 250 pets get adopted. In addition, private pet owners can put their animals up for adoption once a week on air live during the newscast.
- * **TRAFFIC** A helicopter and reporter are used to provide traffic reports daily during the newscasts. The live reports total approximately 15-21 minutes between the hours of 6 am – 9 am. Also, traffic segments air during the hour long 5 pm show.
- * **PARENTING INFORMATION** These segments ran approximately 3:30 in length during our hour long 8 am Newscast. They were moderated by one of our Morning Show anchors and used various child psychologists/psychiatrists from Northeast Ohio. We offered timely and practical advice for parents on a variety of

subjects. These segments occur live in our studio. Sometimes we brought in educators, child advocates, safety experts and other professionals to offer valuable and timely advice for parents on a variety of topics.

Breaking News Updates

WJW broke into and/or preempted regularly-scheduled programming on numerous occasions during the period covered by this report in order to bring its viewers breaking news or disaster information. This coverage included extended reporting on tornado warnings and other severe weather, amber alerts, the war in Iraq, and other emergencies.

Public Affairs Programming

WJW broadcasts several public affairs programs throughout the year. The programs highlight the Cleveland area with several focusing on the holidays. For example, "Neighborhood" is a quarterly special hosted by FOX 8's own Wayne Dawson. The program spotlights the best people and good works in the Cleveland area. Some highlights from the last year include the Cleveland arts scene, health care professionals with special gifts for aiding Cleveland's young and old, and a musical holiday celebration from E.105th and St. Clair.

In addition, WJW aired a variety of locally produced programs of interest to views in the community. For example, the station airs programs that focus on Cleveland sports, local travel, and local religion.

Political Coverage

WJW has devoted extensive coverage to political issues important to its viewers. During a sample two-week time period, for example, WJW aired pieces on the presidential campaign, local property tax issues, voter fraud, and a local representative that was indicted. The station also sent local reporters to the national party conventions in Boston and New York. Exhibit B attached hereto includes a detailed list of WJW's political programming specials as well as the political issues covered in the station's local newscasts.

Public Service Announcements

WJW makes its air-time throughout the broadcast day available to public service announcements for a variety of causes, such as:

WJW's on-air newscasters and behind-the-scenes employees have made a commitment to participate in the Cleveland community. The station's employees take part in a variety of events in and around the city, such as:

WJW also seeks community input. The station communicates with the community through newscasts, phone calls, letters and e-mails. Throughout its newscasts, WJW asks its viewers to write in or call in to let the station know what they think about a particular topic. There are segments in FOX 8 NEWS AT FIVE and FOX 8 NEWS IN THE MORNING specifically slated for viewer comments that are read on-air. This is also a channel through which the station receives story ideas and topics of interest from within the community. Its Call for Action Volunteers take numerous phone calls from viewers that need help with various situations.

WJW replies to every e-mail that requires a response and keeps all written communication in its Public File.

EXHIBIT A – Local News Stories

COMMUNITY ISSUES

Fox 8 News in the Morning airs Monday-Friday from 5am until 9am. We get so many requests for publicity from non-profit groups in Northeast Ohio that this is one effective way of helping them while providing entertainment and information to our viewers.

9/1/03 Unity Day in the City Of Cleveland

In an effort to let Northeast Ohioians know about a special week of activities and seminars devoted to bridging cultural gaps in the city, the Roberto Ocasio Latin Jazz Project performed on our program. Over the course of two hours, the band performed and our anchors provided information about Unity Day events occurring across Northeast Ohio. The Roberto Ocasio Latin Jazz Project is one of the premier Latin bands in Northeast Ohio. Our viewers were exposed to multi-cultural music and told about local events they could partake in as part of "Unity Day".

9/3/03 Unity Day/Cleveland Mayor Jane Campbell talked about why the city has Unity Day, why there is a need for it, and what events are taking place that viewers can participate in.

10/2/03 Open Hearts, Open Homes

Morning Show Anchor Wayne Dawson produced a story that profiled a local child in need of adoption. This story is part of an on-going relationship with the County Department of Children and Family Services. We provided viewers with information if they are interested in adopting or learning more about adoption.

10/9/03 Ohio Tuition Trust Authority

We aired an interview segment with a spokesperson from Ohio's College Savings Program to explain how the plan works and who can benefit from it.

10/24/03 Amber Alert Law Clarification

A local law and safety expert explains how this system works and when the alert is used and when it is not. A recent child abduction case had put this issue in the headlines.

10/18/03 Cleveland Mayor Jane Campbell discusses Controversial City Layoffs

Recent budget cuts force safety force layoffs. Many city residents are concerned. The Mayor addressed the issue.

1/15/04 Winter Driving Tips

We did two segments on this topic today to hopefully give viewers some valuable advice when hitting the slick winter roads. A Trauma Helicopter MET explained how serious these winter accidents can be. A Highway Patrol Officer demonstrated driving tips, including how to steer out of a skid.

1/19/04 Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday

The Weeden Family Singers entertained our viewers in the 7am and 8am hours. They performed 6 one-minute songs reflective of the holiday. Also, this particular choir is made up of 50 members, four generations of the Weeden Family and Dr. John Weeden, the grandfather who started the choir, who actually worked with the Rev. Martin Luther King and we talked about King's legacy.

1/29/04, 2/26/04, 4/29/04 Open Hearts, Open Homes

Morning Show Anchor Wayne Dawson produced a story that profiled a local child in need of adoption. This story is part of an on-going relationship with the County Department of Children and Family Services. We provided viewers with information if they are interested in adopting or learning more about adoption.

3/08/04 Kids & Heroin

A local suburban police officer explained how heroin has become the drug of choice for many young people. She explained how widespread the problem is here in Northeast Ohio and offered advice for parents on what to watch for in your kids.

4/9/04 Sexual Predators & Child Lures

A Cleveland Police Officer shared valuable information about the various lures a sexual predator might use. This information was particularly timely because of a recent local abduction case.

5/7/04 Letter Carrier Community Food Drive

A local letter carrier explained the upcoming Food Drive and how serious a need there is for canned food donations.

In addition, private pet owners can put their animals up for adoption once a week on air live during the newscast. The segment runs 1:00 and a phone number is given for viewers to call.

TRAFFIC

A helicopter and reporter are used to provide traffic reports daily during the newscasts. The live reports total approximately 15-21 minutes between the hours of 6am-9am. Also, traffic segments air during the hour long 5p show. These segments total 2:45-3:30 minutes daily.

PARENTING INFORMATION

These segments ran approximately 3:30 in length during our hour long 8am Newscast. They were moderated by one of our Morning Show Anchors and used various Child Psychologists/Psychiatrists from Northeast Ohio. We offered timely and practical advice for parents on a variety of subjects. These segments occur live in our studio. Sometimes we brought in educators, child advocates, safety experts and other professionals to offer valuable and timely advice for parents on a variety of topics.

GARDENING/HOME IMPROVEMENT INFORMATION

Fox 8 News in the Morning, which airs Monday through Friday 5am-9am offers a variety of segments with valuable advice to viewers on gardening and home improvement topics. We have a gardening expert named A.J. Petitti who demonstrates various topics relating to gardening. Our research shows that gardening is often the #1 interest or hobby of many of our viewers. These segments offer timely gardening advice for Northeast Ohioians, as well as lawn care and yard care. These segments run approximately 3:30 in length and are done live from a yard or garden center. We normally air one in the 7am show and one in the 8am show twice a month. In addition to gardening, we also produce a variety of home decorating and home improvement segments with an expert from Home Depot. These stories show viewers how they can tackle a number of projects around their homes. These segments usually air as pre-produced packages. They run about 3 minutes in length. Sometimes we bring the home improvement expert into the studio and do a live demonstration.

Local Newscasts and Key Stories

KDFW airs **43.5** hours of local news each week, at the following times:

Monday – Friday, 5 a.m. – 9 a.m.

Monday – Friday, 12 p.m. – 12:30 p.m.

The station also airs 10.0 hours of local news repeats each week to offer its audience a flexible schedule for viewing the news.

KDFI airs a 15-minute newscast following every Texas Rangers and Dallas Stars telecast – there were a total of 97 such telecasts in 2003.

KDFW and KDFI maintain a strong commitment to local news that includes assigning reporters to specific community-based beats. The stations go beyond coverage of local and county governments to include neighborhood issues, local political candidates and topics, and stories important to the different minority communities, groups and organizations working in the Dallas/Ft. Worth area. Although the news staff primarily works from the main office in downtown Dallas, the stations maintain a presence in local bureaus in the surrounding neighborhoods. The station employs a diverse staff of reporters and producers to better cover the many facets of this large market. Provided below is a brief summary of important local news issues that KDFW and KDFI have covered recently within their local news broadcasts:

- * Community reaction to the firing of the Dallas police chief
- * State redistricting and special legislative session
- * Opening of Latino Cultural Center in Dallas
- * Increase in natural gas rates
- * Ft. Worth affordable housing programs

A list of KDFW's and KDFI's local interest news stories and consumer reports is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Breaking News Updates

KDFW broke into and/or preempted regularly-scheduled programming hundreds of times during the period covered by this report in order to bring its viewers breaking news or disaster information. This coverage included extended reporting on severe weather, political news (such as President Reagan's funeral) and local crime news. In addition, each of KDFW and KDFI inserted amber alert and severe weather crawls into their programming at least 90 times in an effort to provide its viewers with vitally important missing persons and local weather updates as quickly as possible.

Public Affairs Programming

KDFW and KDFI each broadcast a half-hour weekly public affairs program called "Insights." The program is the oldest public affair show in Dallas/Ft. Worth. It addresses issues and topics of concern to the community – particularly communities of color within the Dallas/Ft. Worth area. Attached as Exhibit B hereto is a comprehensive list of the stories covered by "Insights" during the time period covered by this report.

In addition, both KDFW and KDFI air a variety of other local programming of interest to the viewers in Dallas/Ft. Worth. For example, KDFW has broadcast special programs relating to a local marathon, weather preparedness, and the anniversary of President Kennedy's assassination. KDFI produces and airs local Texas Rangers and Dallas Stars baseball and hockey games.

Political Coverage

KDFW and KDFI have devoted extensive time to coverage of political issues important to their viewers. During the time period covered by this report, for instance, KDFW has aired special coverage of zoning issues and development (including the new proposed Cowboys stadium), budgets and taxes, and the impact of population growth on local municipal services. Similarly, KDFI has provided coverage of the Dallas County sheriff's campaign. Both stations covered the Texas legislature's special session related to redistricting. In addition, for the two-week sample time period running September 13-27, 2004, KDFW aired approximately 200 minutes of local and national political coverage during its newscasts.

Public Service Announcements

KDFW and KDFI make their air-time throughout the broadcast day available to public service announcements for a variety of causes, such as:

For each of two sample weeks (January 12-19 and June 14-21, 2004), KDFI broadcast more than 175 minutes of public service announcements – all without charging any of the organizations or causes for the time. Similarly, for the sample week June 14-21, 2004, KDFW broadcast more than 27 minutes of public service announcements (it did not broadcast any during the week of January 12-19 because the station had just completed a six-week "Toys for Tots" initiative).

Participation in the Community

Both KDFW's and KDFI's on-air newscasters and behind-the-scenes employees have made a commitment to participate in the Dallas/Ft. Worth community. The stations' employees take part in a variety of events in and around Dallas/Ft. Worth, such as:

SPECIALTY NEWS (*Consumer, Investigative and Medical Stories*)

The FOX 4 News “News Projects Unit” produces specialized Consumer, Health/Medical and Investigative stories. Virtually all of these stories are local reporting specifically developed to provide service to the community. Many have won local, state and national awards.

Health/Medical stories air each day between 5am – 9am, and during the news at 5pm and 9pm. FOX 4 News airs an average of 35 minutes a week or 2 ½ hours a month of locally produced health/medical reports. Topics cover local medical breakthroughs (e.g. cancer research and treatment, transplant and separation surgery), public health alerts and emergencies (e.g. West Nile Virus, Flu outbreak, childhood immunizations) and individual stories of people in various communities building health/medical awareness (e.g. providing health care for indigents, the state insurance crisis, prenatal care, general fitness and healthy living).

Consumer stories air twice a week between 5am – 9am, and during the news at 5:30pm and 9pm. FOX 4 News airs on average 30 minutes a week or 2 hours a month locally produced consumer oriented news. These stories range from fraud alerts to product testing and money-saving advice.

KDFW FOX 4 produces 5 unique segments each week (we call these stories Franchise Segments). These stories provide a direct link between viewers and our newsroom using either voice messaging or E-Mail. Each franchise segment offers viewers an opportunity to make their ideas, opinions, story suggestions, complaints and problems heard. Locally produced franchise stories:

- ✓ **Street Squad:** Tuesday, FOX 4 News at 9pm, Wednesday, FOX 4 News at 530pm. Problems on local roads and highways are identified and when possible corrected. Many of the ideas and tips come directly from viewers.
- ✓ **Deal or Dud:** Wednesday, FOX 4 News at 9pm, Thursday, FOX 4 News at 530pm. Products are tested by viewers.
- ✓ **Whatever happened to.....**, Thursday, FOX 4 News at 9pm. Viewers call or write asking for updates on previously aired stories.
- ✓ **Viewers' Voice:** Friday, FOX 4 News at 5:30pm & 9pm. A “made for television letters to the editor segment” using calls and e-mails from viewers commenting on news from the past week and how we covered it.

EXHIBIT B – Public Affairs Programming

Following are stories covered by "Insight" during the last year:

September 7, 2003- DALLAS FIRES CITY'S FIRST AFRICAN AMERICAN POLICE CHIEF

Racial issues arose surround the firing of Chief Terrell Bolton. There were protests, public racial slurs, demonstrations and much discontent. We had in studio Joyce Foreman, president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference as she apologized to Jesse Diaz, President of the League of United Latin Americans for a racial slur against Hispanics that one of her protestors had written on his sign. The firing followed much discontent by Mayor Laura Miller and pressure on Dallas City Manager Ted Benevides to alleviate some of the major problems and controversy in the Dallas Police Department.

September 14, 2003 - FOX TEENS TALKING

This was the fourth and final installment in a series of programs which gave area teens a public platform to address issues of importance to them. Each show focused on a different topic including Today's Drug Use Among Teens, Communalization Problems with Parents, Safe and Wise Dating and Education.

September 21, 2003 - LATINO CULTURAL CENTER (Hispanic Heritage Month)

After many years of fundraising, the Latino Cultural Center finally opened. In a city of nearly, 3-million people, Latinos make up about 1/3 of the population of Dallas. This center will showcase the very vibrant culture of the Latino community. Also, the Anita Martinez Ballet Folklorico performed. This was one of the first groups to appear on stage at the Latino Cultural Center.

UNIVERSOUL CIRCUS

A feature segment about the only African American owned and operated circus in the world. The circus is based out of Atlanta, Georgia and features Dallas' own comedian, Shucky Ducky as ringmaster.

CLEARSHAVE

One of the most annoying health issues facing African American men is razor bumps. Noted dermatologist, Dr. Vergie Bright Ellington demonstrates a new product for African American men to help ease the pain, and infection, that is sometimes caused by shaving.

September 28, 2003 - AMACHI PROGRAM

The Amachi program is a new outreach effort by Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Dallas. It is designed to assist children whose parents are incarcerated. Mentors assist with visitations to see their parents in prison and other issues

these children face. Several churches picked up the torch and became mentors for these children as well.

HISPANIC MILITARY WOMEN (Hispanic Heritage Month)

In celebration of Hispanic Heritage month, Insights saluted the highest ranking Hispanic woman in U.S. military History, Retired Army Lieutenant Colonel Consuelo Castillo Kickbusch. Lt. Col. Kickbusch Grew up in the barrios of Laredo, Texas in very poor circumstances. She was reared by parents who could not read or write but who encouraged her to keep going...and she did.

October 5, 2003 - ALLERGIES

Story by FOX 4's medical reporter, John Hammarley, about fall Allergies and why they are worst in the metroplex than other cities.

CELEBRATING LIFE FOUNDATION

This was another segment for National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Sylvia Dunnavant, author and photographer of the award Winning book, "Celebrating Life" delivered information about Breast cancer and detection for African American women specifically. Also, she talked about her fundraiser walk to generate funds for breast cancer research.

MAGIC JOHNSON AND ST. PHILIPS SCHOOL

The one and only basketball superstar and multi-million dollar entrepreneur makes a special appearance at St. Philips School in South Dallas for a fundraiser. St. Philips is a high energy, private school for low income children who need scholarships to attend.

October 12, 2003 - SUSAN G. KOMEN

FOX 4 is the exclusive media sponsor for the Susan G. Komen-Dallas Race for the Cure run. Our entire program was dedicated to information about breast cancer awareness. We featured Dr. Kimberly Udell who demonstrated how to do a breast self-exam and an interview with Nancy Brinker, the founder of the organization and her sister, Susan G. Koman who suffered with breast cancer. Also, we featured the stories of many survivors, including a man, who fought breast cancer and won.

October 19, 2003 - QUINCY CARTER

FOX 4 sports reporter/anchor, Nita Wiggins, sat down for a talk with Quincy Carter, the first African American Quarterback for the NFL's Dallas Cowboys team. He talked about his career and personal contributions to the community.

DELORIS JORDAN

Interview with Deloris Jordan, the eldest sister of the world-renowned basketball legend, Michael Jordan. In her new book, "In My Family's

Shadow”, Deloris talks about the sexual and mental abuse she suffered at the hands of her father and her estrangement from the Jordan family, including Michael, for writing this book.

JANI-KING

One of the largest Hispanic owned franchised businesses is located right here in the metroplex. It is a commercial cleaning service called Jani-King. It was created by businessman Jerry Crawford. This is a regular sponsorship for the station. Our contacts are Retired General William Gossell and Major Paul Courtaway. Last year we helped them bring in thousands of toys for children and we plan to participate as an exclusive media sponsor this year.

Parkland Hospital

We keep in touch with Eric Wesley, Director of Corporate Communications, at Parkland Hospital about programs of interest we may be able to assist them with. The Parkland "Kids First" insurance program is a regular sponsor of one segment of our public affairs program, "Insights".

Jingle Bell Run

We worked with the Carter Blood Center (a not for profit blood bank) for this special holiday run. This event and our coverage alerts the public to the need to donate blood regularly.

Girls, Inc.

Our general manager, Kathy Saunders, sits on the board of our local Girls, Inc. organization. Each year, the girls visit the television station to produce a promotional spot for its fundraising luncheon and we produce the video of the honorees shown at the luncheon. The executive director, Ruth Thomas makes an annual appearance on our public affairs program, "Insights".

Partnership for a Drug Free America

About twice a year we meet with representatives from the Partnership for a Drug Free America. They give us up-to-date information about drug usage. We run public service announcements.

Genesis Women's Shelter

Offered advice to Executive Director and founder Ann Williams about promotion of the past season's performances. Our station was not able to sponsor the event, but we did involve some of our news talent in the events.

Our sports Director/Anchor Mike Doocy and our Community Affairs Director Rochelle Brown work with the March of Dimes to help them raise money for birth defects and pre-natal screening. Representatives of the March of Dimes appeared on our public affairs program several times to promote the event.

We feature this organization each year on our public affairs program to help promote their educational and cultural programs. Also, the organization helped us

Dallas Urban League

Talk with executive director, Beverly Mitchell-Brooks about the job training programs and outreach efforts of the DUL.

Dallas Housing Authority

We are represented at their annual luncheon where new information about Section 8 housing is delivered.

Dallas County Home Loan Counseling Service

Speak often with Jamie Fitchko, the executive director, about new moneys that come into the area for home loans for first time homeowners. This organization helps to qualify and secure financing for its clients.

Local Newscasts and Key Stories

KDVR airs **20.5** hours of local news each week, at the following times:

Monday – Friday, 5:30 a.m. – 8 a.m.

Monday – Friday, 9 p.m. – 10 p.m.

Saturday – Sunday, 5 p.m. – 5:30 p.m.

Provided below is a brief summary of important local news issues that KDVR has covered recently within its local news broadcasts:

- * Flu Epidemic: Colorado was hit harder than any other state with the flu. Nearly 8,000 people contracted the flu, more than a dozen people died. KDVR's reporting included tips on prevention, why the strain wasn't 100% combated by flu shots and the eventual shortage of vaccine. The station also provided comprehensive information on vaccinations for children and the elderly.
- * CU Recruiting Scandal: KDVR covered multiple elements as the Colorado University football program's alleged offenses became public. Seven women allege they were sexually assaulted by football team members. There are also allegations that the team used sex with co-eds as a recruiting tool.
- * Colorado Wildfires: KDVR provided extensive live coverage of major wildfires in the metro area in the fall of 2003, and the spring and summer of 2004. There were a ½ dozen major fires which caused evacuations in that time period.
- * Hi-Tech Breast Detection: Health Reporter Shaul Turner exposed cutting-edge technology which can detect breast cancer in women ten years earlier than a mammogram.

A list of KDVR's local interest news stories is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Breaking News Updates

KDVR broke into and/or preempted regularly-scheduled programming at least 252 times during the period covered by this report in order to bring its viewers breaking news or disaster information. This coverage included extensive reports regarding severe weather (such as tornadoes), wildfires, emerging local news and traffic stories.

Public Affairs Programming

KDVR broadcasts the following public affairs programs:

Colorado's Most Wanted/Crimestoppers: Every week KDVR works in conjunction with Crimestoppers to produce and air a story about an unsolved crime in the community.

Since Colorado's Most Wanted began airing on KDVR, police report more than 1000 suspects have been captured due to viewer tips. The station also produces quarterly ½ hour "Colorado's Most Wanted" specials where it reprises some of the unsolved crimes and asks viewers to phone in tips to a live phone bank manned at the station.

Severe Weather Specials: Each Winter, Spring, Summer and Fall, KDVR produces an "On-Target Weather Special." The purpose is to provide viewers with critical information to prepare for serious storms. The station shows what can happen in severe weather, and gives viewers tips on protecting themselves and preparing their families.

Product Testing Specials: Each week the station's "Troubleshooter Team" puts a product to the test. They look at whether the product is safe and effective, then give it a recommendation. Quarterly, the station puts these product testing segments together into a consumer-focused ½ hour special.

Zappolo's People: Quarterly, main anchor Ron Zappolo produces a public affairs ½ hour special. Ron interviews leaders in the business, minority, political, philanthropy, entertainment and sports communities in Colorado and around the nation.

Spotlight on Health: Quarterly ½ hour specials highlighting the most significant and important health stories done by Health Reporter Shaul Turner.

Signature Stories: Photographer pieces run weekly highlighting ordinary people doing extraordinary things in the community. KDVR has focused on community volunteers and high-achieving children, for example. The station takes the best stories and highlights them in a ½ hour special each quarter.

Political Coverage

KDVR has devoted extensive time to coverage of political issues important to its viewers. During the time period covered by this report, for instance, KDVR has aired special coverage of the announcement that U.S. Sen. Campbell intended to retire. The station then covered the campaign for the open U.S. Senate seat in Colorado. Furthermore, the station airs several half-hour "You Decide" election specials each election period. These specials provide in-depth examination of issues and candidates in Colorado elections. In addition, for the two-week sample time period running September 13-27, 2004, the station aired devoted approximately 10 percent of its newscasts to political coverage

Public Service Announcements

KDVR makes its air-time throughout the broadcast day available to public service announcements for a variety of causes, such as:

For each of two sample weeks (January 12-19 and June 14-21, 2004), KDVR broadcast an average of at least 48 minutes of public service announcements – all without charging any of the organizations or causes for the time.

Participation in the Community

KDVR's on-air newscasters and behind-the-scenes employees have made a commitment to participate in the Denver community. The station's employees take part in a variety of events and causes in and around Denver, such as:

- * Adoption Exchange
- * Big Brothers/Big Sisters
- * Colorado State Fair
- * Denver Botanical Gardens
- * Denver Police Department community forum
- * Local school career fairs
- * Easter Seals softball tournament

A comprehensive list of the station's participation in the community is attached as Exhibit B hereto.

KDVR constantly gathers information about the needs and interests of the members of its community, both through meetings with community leaders and through interaction with viewers. Last year, for example, KDVR hosted a community leader meeting at its studio. The station invited key leaders from minority communities, religious organizations, law enforcement, and non-profit organizations and asked them to share important issues facing their communities. The station also maintains a news tipline and receives Internet and email comments from viewers. KDVR's newsroom also utilizes a "rainbow rolodex" of experts capable of offering differing viewpoints on various issues.

EXHIBIT A – Local News Stories

Provided below is a sampling of KDVR news stories reported in the period of 9/01/03-8/31/04 that dealt with issues of concern to the community:

Flu Epidemic: Colorado was hit harder than any other state with the flu. Nearly 8,000 people contracted the flu, more than a dozen people died. Our reporting included tips on prevention, why the strain wasn't 100% combated by flu shots and the eventual shortage of vaccine. FOX 31 News also provided comprehensive information on vaccinations for children and the elderly.

Terror Alert Orange: Shortly before Christmas the terror alert was upped. We covered the local impact on travel and transportation. Denver had to spend millions of dollars to increase security at public buildings and facilities.

Pilot Training: FOX 31 obtained exclusive access to government firearms training of airline pilots. We showed viewers exactly what might happen on a plane if the pilot is armed and explained the training they are getting.

Mad Cow in U.S.: The first confirmed case of Mad Cow hit Washington State. Our local angle coverage was very important as the cattle industry is critical to the Colorado economy.

Mad Cow/Stock Show: We explored the implications and impact of mad cow disease on the National Western Stock show, which is held each year in Denver.

Inside Norad: An exclusive look inside NORAD in Colorado Springs. This will be the first television crew allowed inside since extensive renovations were made this fall.

President Bush Space Plan: Complete coverage of the local impact which could occur if the President's space exploration plan is approved. Lockheed Martin and several other local companies stand to benefit.

CU Recruiting Scandal: FOX 31 covered multiple elements as the CU football program's alleged offenses became public. Seven women allege they were sexually assaulted by football team members. There are also allegations that the team used sex with co-eds as a recruiting tool. Head Football Coach Gary Barnett has been placed on paid leave while an independent investigation is underway.

Drug Lawsuit: A FOX 31 Exclusive. Reporter Heidi Hemmat obtained video of a drug raid, where a woman claimed police mistreated her. Heidi showed video of the arrest and found some startling details in the woman's arrest record. The North Metro Drug Task Force wrote a letter to FOX 31 singling us out for fair and balanced reporting.

Sex Offender Sentencing: Our investigative team showed that some Colorado judges are giving convicted sex offenders NO jail time, because sex offender treatment is not available in some state prisons. The judges reason that since the offenders won't be rehabilitated, they don't want to make them worse in prison. Needless to say victims and victim's families are upset.

Vigilante Moms: A Troubleshooter investigation showing the work of a group called "Perverted Justice". They are mothers who pose as young girls on the internet and "chat" with men. They then expose the men and put their picture on the "Perverted Justice" web page.

Troubleshooter: Horse Auction: Tom Martino investigation into Colorado State University selling donated horses at auction to buyers who send the horses to slaughter for food. We worked in concert with KDFW.

Troubleshooter: Water Filtration: A confrontation with a man who was selling incredibly overpriced water filtration systems after showing people bogus water testing results.

Troubleshooter: Grocery Overcharging: Investigation showing which Colorado grocery stores are fined most often for violations in overcharging and not weighing items properly.

Teen Black Box: Anchor Libby Weaver piece on a device that can track the movements of teen drivers. This piece was in response to a marked increase in teen accidents in the metro area.

Hi-Tech Breast Detection: Health Reporter Shaul Turner exposed cutting-edge technology which can detect breast cancer in women ten years earlier than a mammogram.

Car Theft VIN: Investigation into the practice of switching VIN on stolen vehicles to keep them from being recovered.

Google-ize: We showed how with just a phone number, you can get incredible amounts of information on a person from the Google website, including a map to their house.

Gas Prices: Gas prices hit their highest mark in the history of our state. We did a unique comparison showing some of the other liquids we buy are much more expensive. For example, if you were to buy a gallon of the prescription allergy drug Flonase, it would cost more than \$7,000.00.

EMT Drug Abuse: A FOX 31 News investigation revealed abuse of drugs by some EMT and paramedics.

Spotlight on Diversity: A regular "beat" on FOX 31 News, our reporters are encouraged to explore issues involving effort to promote understanding between the various diverse populations in Colorado.

Spotlight on Health: Ongoing nightly coverage of issues related to health.

Spotlight on Education: Ongoing coverage of issues involving education for all ages and in all levels of schooling.

Spotlight on Family: Coverage of issues or ideas which can help families function better. Main anchor Libby Weaver explores areas involving childcare, child education, family structure, and advice on parenting and breakthrough products to help around the house.

KDVR makes regular efforts to communicate with its community. Below is a list of some of the station's efforts over the past year:

PIO/Community Leader Meeting: December 12 we invited key leaders from minority communities, religious organizations, public affairs, law enforcement, political organizations and non-profits to our studio. We showed them a preview of our new morning newscast, Good Day Colorado. We asked them for reaction, and told them who to contact at FOX 31 News and how to get their stories on the air. We also held a Q and A forum asking those leaders what the important issues were in their communities and how we could better serve the people they represent. The General Manager, News Director, News Anchors and all News Managers heard the comments and answered the questions.

NABJ, NAHJ, NAAJ, CABJ, CAHJ Communication: The News Director gets consistent communication from the National Association of Black Journalists, Hispanic Journalists, Asian Journalists and the Colorado Association of Black Journalists as well as the Colorado Association of Hispanic Journalists. This communication includes newsletters outlining important issues in the community as well as promising applicants looking for jobs.

Rainbow Rolodex: In our newsroom computer system we keep a complete and updated list of minority contacts. The purpose is to have a list of "experts" we can go to who represent different viewpoints, rather than the same old list other stations have

News Tipline: Every night and morning newscast we solicit viewer story ideas.

Web-Page e-mail Comments: We have a form on FOX31.com where viewers are encouraged to share their story ideas and comments.
