Local Newscasts and Key Stories

WDAF airs **49.0** hours of local news each week, at the following times:

Monday – Friday, 5 a.m. – 9 a.m.

Monday – Friday, 12 p.m. – 1 p.m.

Monday – Friday, 5 p.m. – 6:30 p.m.

Monday – Friday, 9 p.m. – 10:30 p.m.

Saturday – Sunday, 7 a.m. – 9 a.m.

Saturday – Sunday, 5 p.m. – 6 p.m.

Saturday – Sunday, 9 p.m. – 10:30 p.m.

Provided below is a brief summary of important local news issues that WDAF has covered recently within its local news broadcasts:

- * *Local Government* - WDAF provided coverage of Missouri's concealed gun law, and efforts by some Kansas City city council members to impose limitations.
- * *Environment* – Station covered efforts to begin a curbside recycling program in Kansas City.
- * *Law Enforcement* – Federal, state and local law enforcement agencies teamed up to prevent welfare fraud.
- * *Economy* – WDAF reported on efforts to deal with Kansas City's \$24 million budget shortfall, which included a hiring freeze and potential furloughs and layoffs.
- * *Education* – A report detailed the Lawrenceville school district's creation of a curriculum for a virtual school to cater to the increasing number of parents who home school their children.
- * *Transportation* – Area transportation planners studied commuter rail options to ease congestion along Interstate 70.

Breaking News Updates

WDAF broke into and/or preempted regularly-scheduled programming hundreds of times during the period covered by this report in order to bring its viewers breaking news or disaster information. This coverage included extended reporting on severe weather and

developing local news stories, including local flu deaths and a local shooting. In addition, WDAF inserted severe weather crawls into its programming numerous times in an effort to provide its viewers with vitally important local weather updates as quickly as possible. WDAF also participates in the amber alert system and has inserted numerous crawls into its programming in an effort to provide its viewers with vitally important information about missing persons as quickly as possible.

Public Affairs Programming

WDAF has broadcast a variety of local public affairs programming of interest to the viewers in its community. For example, the station has aired several special programs relating to winter weather and tornadoes. In addition, WDAF has aired specials relating to the Kansas City Chiefs and Royals. The station also addresses numerous public affairs issues throughout its 49 hours of local newscasts each week.

Political Coverage

WDAF has devoted extensive time to coverage of political issues important to its viewers. During the time period covered by this report, for instance, WDAF has aired special coverage of transportation tax proposals on this year's election ballot and April's municipal elections taking place across Kansas, as well as extensive coverage of the presidential campaign. In addition, for the two-week sample time period running September 13-27, 2004, the station aired nearly 70 minutes of political coverage during its newscasts. Exhibit B attached hereto includes a detailed list of WGHP's political programming specials as well as the political issues covered in the station's local newscasts.

Public Service Announcements

WDAF makes its air-time throughout the broadcast day available to public service announcements for a variety of causes, such as:

WDAF constantly gathers information about the needs and interests of the members of its community, particularly by hosting ascertainment meetings with members of the Kansas City community. The station has hosted two ascertainment meetings in the past year, and attendees included representatives from the KCMO Police Department, The Keelre Center for Women, Parkville Business Association, Diabetes Prevention and Control Program, and the Johnson County Chapter of the NAACP, among others.

Local Newscasts and Key Stories

KTTV airs **27.0** hours of local news each week, at the following times:

Monday – Friday, 5 a.m. – 9 a.m.

Monday – Sunday, 10 p.m. – 11 p.m.

In addition, KCOP airs 3.5 hours of local news each week, Monday – Sunday, 11 p.m. – 11:30 p.m.

Provided below is a brief summary of important local news stories that the stations have covered recently within the local news broadcasts:

- * **Immigration** - Extensive coverage on the overall impact of illegal immigration in the broadcast area, ranging from fiscal crisis on local education and health systems, to the impact on workers, businesses and families. Issues range from the fact that some families face deportation of parents while children are legally born on American soil and are American citizens to the denying drivers licenses for illegal immigrants.
- * **Crime** - Extensive coverage on youth gangs and the loss of promising, innocent teens to gang warfare, the increase in white collar crime, and various drug enterprises affecting all in the viewing audience. Special focus on community groups organizing efforts to stop the violence among the youth of this greater metropolitan area covering the counties of San Bernardino, Riverside, Ventura, Los Angeles and Orange.
- * **Consumer** - Reporting on various stories affecting the livelihood of the viewing audiences. Coverage includes credit card scams, job placement and fairs, how to prevent and restore your identity if stolen, and the recurring “Ask the Expert” segment on the FOX morning news block – news coverage reflects consumer news you can use.
- * **Economic** - News reports cover a wide scope of stories from how businesses deal with mounting worker compensation costs, to how compliance with state standards force some businesses to relocate. Additionally, coverage includes the California state government and how its economic decisions impact the state’s overall economic climate. Updates are also provided on the ever changing real estate market that is empowering some families to purchase homes while putting homeownership out of reach for others.
- * **Environment** - Continuing coverage ranges from polluted lakes and beaches to clean air and cleaner burning and more fuel efficient automobiles.

A comprehensive list of the stations' local news stories is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Breaking News Updates

The stations break into regularly scheduled programming to bring issues of personal safety and disaster updates to the viewing audience. The scope of the news coverage includes disaster reporting on earthquakes, severe weather conditions, wild brush fires and police action when warranted. Child abduction / Amber alert crawls and weather updates are inserted into regularly scheduled programming to provide viewers with timely and vital updates on conditions affecting their safety.

Public Affairs Programming

The stations broadcast "Midday Sunday", a 30 minute weekly program during most of the year. They have also done 30 minute news specials on Asian American heritage, the stem cell debate, mothers, and miracles from Mexico. Some of the key topics covered on the programs include:

- * **Social Issues:** Domestic Violence; School Segregation; Homophobia; Child Care; Identity thefts; Economic Development; Cultural History; High Speed Transit; Muslim Culture; and Homelessness
- * **Community:** Museums; Libraries; Griffith Park Observatory; Mexican Art; Hispanic Films; Public Safety; Housing; Identity theft; Disabilities; People meters; Women's contributions; Education; The Differently Abled; Issues of the Aging; Music's cultural influence; and Native American issues
- * **Political:** Globalization; Gay, Lesbian & Transgender impact on election; Taxes; Consumer Rights; Documentaries; Music as medium
- * **Health:** Air Pollution; Child Care; MS; Water safety; Hearing problems; Nutrition; and Breastfeeding

Political Coverage

The stations devoted extensive coverage to political issues important to their viewers. During a two-week time period, for example, the stations aired pieces on the presidential campaign, local council elections, the debate over immigrant licenses, the vote on greenhouse emission regulation and the Long Beach Council vote on dog zones. The stations also provided coverage of a number of other public forums during the entire period covered by this report. Exhibit B attached hereto includes a detailed list of political programming specials as well as the political issues covered in the stations' local newscasts.

Public Service Announcements

The stations make air-time throughout the broadcast day available to public service announcements for a variety of causes, such as:

Various station personnel, including the General Manager, Department Heads, Community Relations, Human Resources, News Management and Talent participated. News and Public Affairs Programming

KTTV “Mid Day Sunday” Weekly public affairs airing on KTTV FOX 11 Sunday mornings from 9:00 AM to 9:30 AM. We take a look at a diverse range of issues and topics of interest to the Los Angeles broadcast area, including social issues, politics, community issues, health, education history and cultural events.

As part of our regular news programming KTTV/ FOX 11 News produces timely news special on topical issues centering on community and public issues affecting viewers within our broadcast audience. These specials included the following programs:

“Hispanic Heritage” - Special half-hour presentation on Cinco de Mayo, celebrating the Hispanic heritage in the greater Los Angeles area, through profiles of Hispanic leaders and cultural points of interest.
September 25, 2003

“Southern California Fires”- Live half hour special on how to address personal claims and insurance concerns caused by the devastating October wildfires. Reports from different agencies on informing victims on how to file for aid, assistance and expediting services to get back on your feet.
October 30, 2003

“So the World May Hear” –A half hour special on efforts made to have children who are hearing impaired have access to audio hearing devices so they can hear for the first time in their lives. Shot primarily in Mexico, profiles the people and organizations both north south of the border, which make this incredible program work.
October 31, 2003

This story featured the top ten most dangerous jobs for teens. Such jobs are construction, roofing, cleaning windows among others. Teens are excited about getting a job (as are their parents) that they overlook very real dangerous.

PROPERTY TAX-Multi-million businesses pay next to nothing per square foot in taxes, in comparison to homeowners. That's thanks to a loophole-ridden law Proposition 13. Disneyland pays four cents per square footage, Capitol Records, pays twenty-four cents. A homeowner in West Los Angeles pays fifty dollars a square foot. According to the law, most businesses do not need their property reassessed for taxes because they don't exchange ownership as frequently as homeowners. Especially in this super-heated housing market. Those against Prop 13 say business owners should have their business reassessed every four years. Those in favor say that if we raise property taxes, businesses will leave the state resulting in a loss of jobs.

MINORITY ETHNIC**12-12-03**

IMMIGRANT RIGHTS/LATINO BOYCOTT -Latinos joined in a statewide boycott named "Economic Brownout" in protest against Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger plan not to allow undocumented immigrants to have driver's licenses. In the Santa Ana Unified School District there was a boycott by student from 95% regular attendance to below 70% attendance, this inspite of the fact student could have won a television set or other schools offered popcicles for not staying home. Other school districts across the state show similar numbers.

MINORITY/ETHNIC**07-24-04**

MEXICO POLICE CORRUPTION-This is an investigative piece on Mexico's police corruption, an incident caught on tape. A local Los Angeles filmmaker rented a house in Rosarito Beach, Mexico, in order to film an R-rated romantic comedy. He was doing nothing illegal (since he had a permit) and minding his own business, when local police and swat stormed inside the home. The accused the filmmaker of having drugs guns and making a porn movie. An undercover camera caught an officer asking for the man for bribe. Stating that if HE only paid six thousand dollars in cash, the arrest and incident would go away. When the filmmaker tried to make a report against the corrupted official he only got the run around and got no where.

MINORITY/ETHNIC**04-06-04**

ILLEGAL IMMIGRANT BUST-Sixty illegal immigrants were found living in eight different motel rooms in Inglewood and were detained by INS officials. Some of the detainees had paid smugglers up to fifteen hundred dollars to come to the United States from Mexico. Police were tipped off to then raid the motel. Initially, authorities did not know they would come across so many people. All immigrants were deported back. One person was arrested, believed to be the smuggler, also know as a "coyote".

MINORITY/ETHNIC**05-19-04**

IMMIGRANT/BUST (And Follow Up Story)-Story featured a drop house where illegal immigrants had been smuggled into the country. More than eight people, including women and a couple of children, were found crammed into the Canoga Park house. Pack rat conditions were found. Police got a call from a family member who did not have the money to pay off the smuggler. INS arrested five people, including the smugglers. All, with the exception of a few witnesses were deported back mostly to Mexico.

MINORITY/ETHNIC 06-27-04

STOP RAIDS RALLY- (Series of reports on this issue.)

Border Patrol is patrolling more than just the border. The threat of immigration raids is keeping many Los Angeles undocumented immigrants holed up in their homes and fearful of coming out. Protestors at various rallies, want an end to the type of policy in which people of Latin American origin are being systematically picked up and profiled, then deported. INS officials deny that they have

MINORITY/ETHNIC 06-24-04

INLAND BORDER SWEEPS—Community leaders and immigrant rights groups are angry at patrol agents who're now targeting Latino residents inner city communities where there is high number of immigrants such as in the Inland Empire and Temecula areas and deporting them. They protest the raids, making some residents fearful to be seen in public. Homeland security agents deny they are targeting certain groups, they do however state they have a larger area to keep to keep monitoring.

MINORITY/ETHNIC 03-09-04

PACKED VAN/ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS-More than twenty people were stuffed in the back of a pick up truck who were lucky to be alive, but also faced the fact they were being deported back to their native country. A driver along the 110fwy called CHP when he noticed something odd about so many people crammed in the truck. INS states they are cracking down on immigrant smuggling and the public is to thank for alerting authorities.

MINORITY/ETHNIC 06-29-04

IMMIGRANT MOTEL BUST- (Series of reports on this story.) Two dozen undocumented immigrants were found in a crammed motel room in South Los Angeles. The so-called "coyotes" were no where to be found. These are smugglers who sneak illegal over the border and hold them hostage. We had live aerials of the bust, including two follow up stories. The people found in the motel, mostly male adults from Mexico and Central America. Many had not eaten for days and were waiting for relatives to pay the remainder of the smuggling fee in order to be released.

ban in place.

EDUCATION 3-12-04 LOS ANGELES UNIFIED SHCOOL DISTRICT BUDGET –
With the LAUSD facing a budged crisis. The L-A unified
school district moved to slash it's spending by
nearly 428-million dollars. The school board approved the
cuts and about 480 district jobs will be eliminated, but not
teachers or school police officers.

EDUCATION 4-20-04 LAUSD EMINENT DOMAIN – We reported from an
LAUSD meeting where residents of North Hills, Winnetka
and Reseda were protesting. Their homes were on the verge of
being demolished to make room for a new Valley high school.
The idea of taking the houses sparked a ton of controversy in
the area.

EDUCATION	5-27-04	GARFIELD HIGH OVERCROWDING – We reported about the overcrowding at Garfield high school. The school is currently busting at the seams, it's meant to handle about two thousand kids, but enrollment stands at 48-hundred.
EDUCATION	6-09-04	LOS ANGELES UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT VOTE – We did a report about the LAUSD. In an effort to save money, the LAUSD's board of education has voted to cut the number of local districts from 11 to eight. District officials say the move will save 24 million dollars. The LAUSD needs to reduce its yearly budget by nearly 500 million dollars.
EDUCATION	7-06-04	NEW SCHOOL LABOR OF LOVE – We reported about a new school which opened in South Los Angeles. Neighborhood residents are calling it a diamond in the rough. Saying it is good for the kids, good for the neighborhood and it is not an empty lot anymore.
EDUCATION	7-17-04	ADULT SCHOOL SCAM – Many people attend adult School to improve their lives but that didn't happen to students graduating from the "California alternative high School." Those adults discovered upon graduation that their diplomas were worthless. The school was not accredited as it claimed it was.
MINORITY ISSUES	1-08-04	BUSH IMMIGRATION PLAN – We did a report on President Bush and his proposed immigration reform, that could give millions of undocumented workers temporary visas. The plan received strong criticism, as well as praise.
MINORITY ISSUES	1-25-04	WRONG WAY DRIVERS – We did a report on smugglers who driver on the wrong side of the road just to avoid the Border Patrol. Border patrol agents call them suicidal. Victims say they're homicidal. Drivers going on the wrong way on major interstates. Not drunk or confused but, on purpose, immigrant smugglers desperate not to be caught.
MINORITY ISSUES	1-31-04	DIPLOMAT SMUGGLERS – A Mexican diplomat was busted for smuggling Arabs into the US through Mexico. Investigators say as many as 300 Arabs may have been brought in. This at a time when the security at our borders have been beefed up.
MINORITY ISSUES	3-13-04	KID SMUGGLING – We did a special report about kids being smuggled in across the US Mexican border in an attempt to reunited them with their parents, who are already in the US. The smugglers are paid and the journey is dangerous putting the children in harms way.
MINORITY ISSUES	3-30-04	BURBANK HOME DEPOT-DAY LABORERS – We reported about a plan to build a new Home Depot store along with a controversial day labor facility in the city of Burbank. After much controversy the plan was put on hold.
MINORITY ISSUES	4-03-04	GRUPOS BETA – The US Mexico border is a dangerous

place for illegal immigrants hoping to get into the United States. This as they often fall prey to gangs, bandits and even rapists. Now the Mexican government is dedicating an agency to help save lives.

MINORITY ISSUES	4-21-04	WATTS IMMIGRANTS – We reported about 100 illegal immigrants being held in a rundown house in Watts. The immigrants included men woman and children as young as 10 years old. They told police they crossed the border by foot and were held by the smugglers for ransom. No arrests were made.
MINORITY ISSUES	5-14-04	DRIVER’S LICENSE RALLY – We reported about a rally in support of a bill that would let immigrants apply for a driver’s license. Hundreds of people took part in this rally.
MINORITY ISSUES	5-20-04	WATTS IMMIGRANTS FOLLOW – We followed up on the Watts immigrants story. And we learned Federal Officials weren’t able to build a case against the alleged smugglers. Most of the illegal immigrants have been released from custody.
TRANSPORTATION	10-14-03	MTA STRIKE – We had team coverage of the MTA strike. L-A County's transit system has ground to a halt. The MTA's mechanics were working the picket lines this morning. Leaving commuters stranded.
TRANSPORTATION	10-16-03	MTA STRIKE – We reported that the MTA strike has rolled into its Third day. Both sides in the dispute are expected to meet separately with a state mediator today. The face-to-face talks between the two, not going very well. Making it a nightmare for folks who depend on public transportation to get around.
TRANSPORTATION	10-22-03	MTA STRIKE – As the MTA’s strike went into its 9’Th we reported that mediators working with both sides to try and end the strike. Yet after negotiating all night, the strike was still on.
TRANSPORTATION	11-04-04	MTA STRIKE DEVELOPMENT – As the MTA strike went into its third week the MTA came out with a new threat. They said if the mechanics fail to accept a "final" contract offer... the m-t-a could impose a contract and start hiring new workers.
TRANSPORTATION	11-07-03	MTA STRIKE VOTE – Striking MTA mechanics were negotiating to return to work. We reported about the MTA’s offer to their workers. The mechanics turned down the offer. Which the MTA called their “best and final” offer.
TRANSPORTATION	11-17-03	MTA STRIKE / SHUTTLES – The MTA strike has Left many low-income commuters with no means of transportation. During our 6:AM newscast we reported about a new shuttle service which was rolling out along Florence Avenue in Inglewood.

TRANSPORTATION	11-17-03	MTA STRIKE IS OVER – We reporter that the MTA strike was over. After 35 days buses started rolling again and MTA trains started service in the morning. The striking mechanics settled.
TRANSPORTATION	11-11-03	HIT AND RUN CRISIS - We did a special report about the California hit and run crisis. The Golden State leads the nation in accidents involving a driver who hits someone and then runs for it. 300 people are now being killed every year in California's hit-and-runs. Officers and relatives of victim we spoke to had the same plea... to every driver: If the worst happens, and you've hit someone: don't run, stop, go back, help however you can... and wait for the police.
TRANSPORTATION	2-23-04	CAR STALLS – We aired a special report about cars that stall while going on the freeway. Experts say it's happening more often, because "newer" cars have sensitive computer brains. We gave useful tips to our viewers. If you stall on the freeway, here's what you should do: stay in your car, turn on your hazard lights, call 9-1-1 on your cell phone and wait for help. Also if your car stalls regularly, check the national highway traffic safety administration website to see if other owners have complained.
TRANSPORTATION	5-13-04	CHP M-A-I-T TEAM – We did a special report about the California High Way patrol and their “MAIT” unit – they are The Multi Disciplinary Accident Investigation Team. Whenever there's a major wreck where people are killed, a specialized unit of the highway patrol is called in. The MAIT unit responds to the most horrific and deadly accident scenes car wrecks and collisions. We showed what steps they tale to solve the puzzle of what happened.
TRANSPORTATION	8-23-04	AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS – We reported about a growing concern at LAX, a shortage in air traffic controllers. Many of them are going to retire around the same time. Nearly half of all current controllers will be retiring in the next decade and there are not enough replacements being trained to take their places. Flights up 50-percent since 1981. Staffing down 12-percent. The control tower at l-a-x is one of the most efficient in the nation.
SOCIAL ISSUES	5-18-04 KTTV 10p	CARING FOR PARENTS – This story looked at issues facing people who might soon be caring or aging parents. We offered a checklist that included covering financial, legal, health and safety matters. Also, we visited with residents of a retirement center.
SOCIAL ISSUES	11-26-03 KTTV 10p	INTERNET CHILD PORN -- This report looks at the proliferation of child porn/pedophile related sites on the internet. We spoke with a private investigator and a woman who founded a child protection organization. They say that search engines need to do more to police the activities on their sites. We found that of the

three main search engines, only one went after child porn sites without first receiving complaints.

SOCIAL ISSUES	5-11-04 KTTV 10p	RUSSIAN PROSTITUTES – The smuggling of Eastern European women into the U.S. – especially the Los Angeles area – has been identified as a widespread problem by law enforcement. This report included a raid of a smuggling operation. Police say that many of the women are misled into prostitution, and held as virtual prisoners by the Russian criminals who bring them here.
SOCIAL ISSUES	2-18-04 KTTV 10p	WRONG MAN – This story is about a young Los Angeles man who a month earlier was facing murder charges based on a police line-up and a sketch. He was cleared after his alibi of being at a ballgame was verified by a videotape showing him in the stands. Nevertheless, he never received an apology from police or the District Attorney.
SOCIAL ISSUES	2-6-04 KTTV 10p	COMPULSIVE CLUTTERER – This was a two-part story in which our reporter enlisted the help of a social service agency to assist an elderly woman whose home was filled with trash and other items, posing a health threat to her and her neighbors.
HEALTH	5-14-04 KTTV	DANGEROUS TEEN JOBS – Summer jobs for teens are scarce in our community, so when employers offer high-paying jobs for teens, there's a rush to fill them. Our report identified several jobs aimed at teens that can be dangerous and even illegal, according to the federal government. Also, we spoke with a student who was injured on a job, and a high school counselor.
HEALTH	8-5-04 KTTV	DIABETIC TEEN – A local research hospital issued a report that says that nearly half the eighth graders in our community are on the road to adult diabetes. We found a teen and a pre-teen who have it now, and, in a series of several reports, showed our viewers how this teen was trying to change his lifestyle to cope with the disease. We continue to monitor his progress.
HEALTH	7-31-04 KTTV	DISCIPLINING DOCTORS – Our investigation called into question the effectiveness of the state board that's responsible for disciplining doctors who are convicted of criminal offenses. We reviewed criminal and Medical Board records and sought comment from both the Board and law enforcement officials. The consensus from both is that the Medical Board has a more lenient approach toward convicted doctors than do the courts.

CRISIS – In a series of reports and a half hour special, we looked at the reasons that local hospitals were closing their emergency rooms, and what the implications are for the community. We spoke with doctors, paramedics and public officials to show how state and federal public policy can affect a local health issue.
HEALTH	5-3-04 KTTV	TRAUMA CENTERS -- The L.A. County-operated trauma center system is in a financial squeeze, resulting in the closure of several centers. In a situation that closely mirrors that of hospital operated emergency rooms, the county and local communities are trying to find ways of keeping trauma centers open. In reports that began in May and have continued to the present, we explore the issue from public health, financial and political perspectives.
HEALTH	7-25-04 KTTV	INTERNET PHARMACIES -- The proliferation of internet pharmacies raises health and safety issues for every community. We spoke with a woman whose teenaged son purchased drugs online and died of an overdose. As a result of this death, there is federal legislation pending that would put controls on internet pharmacies.
HEALTH	7-21-04 KTTV	GASTRIC BYPASS – As this medical procedure becomes increasingly popular, we found a patient who suffered severe life-threatening side effects. In a series of reports, we showed how doctors were trying to save this woman’s life by planning another operation to reverse the bypass. But since patient was uninsured, the surgery was put off. Our viewers responded with donations that allowed her to continue to receive treatment until her insurance issues were cleared up.
SOCIAL ISSUES	5-5-04 KTTV	RIALTO POLICE – Internal politics within this suburban police department led to accusations of cronyism and corruption. In several reports, we made public these allegations, coming from police officers themselves. City officials then acknowledged the problem.
SOCIAL ISSUES	6-19-04 KTTV	BREAKING THE CYCLE – In a two-part series and a half hour special, we looked at ways in which parents of gang members are trying to stop the cycle of generational gang affiliation. On one night we spoke with mothers of gang members, and then

the next night we profiled the fathers. This was a community-based effort to control a social problem that affects nearly every city in our viewing area.

SOCIAL ISSUES	7-29-04 KTTV	PRISON REPORT – State prison overcrowding was suggested as a factor in a brawl that our reporter witnessed while touring a local prison. A corrections official told us that overcrowding has led to concerns for the safety of both prisoners and guards.
SOCIAL ISSUES	7-21-04 KTTV	DANGEROUS WEBSITE – A website that appeals to teens was shown in our report to be a front for pedophiles. The site is based in England, where the age of consent is lower. We spoke with local teens who used the site, but were seemingly unaware of how it was being misused. We asked an internet safety educator to explain the dangers of this type of site.
SOCIAL ISSUES	6-23-04 KTTV KCOP	ROUGH ARREST – While covering a police pursuit, we witnessed the police beating of the suspect. Our coverage led to an L.A. police and federal investigation – which is still ongoing. As a result of the incident, police have changed certain policies. The community also has reacted to the beating, but in a calm and measured way that has led to public discussion of police practices.
SOCIAL ISSUES	5-11-04 KTTV	PRISON GUARD ABUSE – In widespread media reports, state prison guards have been accused of brutality and using political influence to quash institutional reform. In this report, we offer the guards’ viewpoints along with a political perspective.
SOCIAL ISSUES	5-4-04 KTTV KCOP	VINE STREET SCHOOL -- Following up on concerns by parents at a local grammar school, we uncovered information that a school employee was under investigation for child molestation. After our report aired, police and school officials met with parents and later the suspect was formally charged. Several children allegedly were involved, and the case is pending.
SOCIAL ISSUES	7-20-04 KTTV	GUN TRAFFICKERS -- With South L.A. plagued by drive-by gang shootings, we wanted to show our viewers why there’s been a proliferation of military style weapons on the streets. Our report focused on how illegal weapons are sold, and the failure of law enforcement authorities to control their sale.
SOCIAL ISSUES	6-21-04 KTTV	GANG ALTERNATIVES – In this report, we look a innovative program to stop gang affiliation before it starts. The program, called GAP – the Gang Alternative Program – begins in the elementary

schools. It's a values-based program that has had positive results in the 40 L.A. schools where it's been implemented.

SOCIAL ISSUES	5-26-04 KTTV	STOLEN LIFE – With identity theft on the rise, we profiled a local man who lost his home to con artists who allegedly forged his signature on quitclaim deeds.

Political Coverage

KTTV/FOX 11 News devoted extensive airtime for vital political issues impacting our viewing audience. During the time period September 2003 to October 2004, KTTV aired several critical specials on election coverage.

The specials included California Decisions 2003: the Gubernatorial Debate. This debate aired on both KTTV and KCOP from 6:00 PM to 7:30 PM as the recall candidates discussed their particular opinions on the issues facing all Californians for the upcoming Recall Election. (9/24/03)

Our viewers were afforded the opportunity to hear opposing points of view on two critical state propositions, Prop 57 and Prop 58. The audience heard from both sides on these ballot measures that would allow the state to borrow additional money to balance the state budget while mandating the legislature to balance the budget in future fiscal years. This half-hour live special was broadcast on February 26, 2004.

On the issue of the gaming industry expansion in the state of California, our viewing audiences was presented with the issue of state proposition 70 on the November 2004 ballot. The arguments for and against were discussed in a live half-hour special broadcast on Friday October 22, 2004. Although the campaign for Proposition 68 has been suspended, it remains on the ballot. Both measures impact the gaming industry which would allow the expansion of gambling interests at racing tracks while the other mandates that Indian tribes contribute a portion of their gross revenue in tax dollars to Sacramento.

On the national stage, KTTV/ FOX 11 News aired a FOX News Special where anchorman Bill O'Reilly interviewed President George W. Bush on his time served in office, covering domestic and international issues and the war on terror. (9/22/03, 8 PM to 9PM, KTTV/FOX 11)

As for the Presidential campaign, KTTV and KCOP aired in their entirety the Presidential debates between President George W. Bush and Democratic challenger, Senator John Kerry on September 30, October 8 and 13, 2004 on both KTTV and KCOP.

Local Newscasts and Key Stories

WHBQ airs **27.0** hours of local news each week, at the following times:

Monday – Friday, 5:30 a.m. – 8 a.m.

Provided below is a brief summary of important local news issues that WHBQ has covered recently within its local news broadcasts:

- * *Community Issues* – MLK Celebrations: 94-year-old Doris Haddock, AKA "Granny D", talks about her walk across the country to raise awareness for campaign finance reform and voting rights. Haddock says she did the walk in remembrance of what Dr. Martin Luther King stood for: equality and social change.
- * *Transportation* – Hybrid Cars: With gas prices on the rise, some Mid-Southerners are not changing their driving habits, but the car they drive. Hybrid cars are selling so quickly at local car dealerships that some dealers are having a hard time keeping up with demand. The hybrid cars get an extra 15-20 miles per gallon.
- * *Drug Abuse* – Meth Problem: Tennessee governor Phil Bredesen creates a task force to help combat methamphetamine abuse. In addition to the Meth Task Force, the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation has set up a Meth Watch hotline for retailers and residents where suspicious purchases and activities can be reported.
- * *Education* – MCS Budget Cuts: The Memphis City Schools Superintendent proposes a \$32 million budget cut. The breakdown of the cuts includes slashing 260 jobs, equipment and health benefits. Board members say the problem started several years ago, from not tightening the budget when necessary.
- * *Local Government* – Chumney Civil War: Memphis City Council-woman, Carol Chumney, asks for a repeal of a city charter amendment which allows elected and appointed officials to qualify for pension benefits after only 12 years of service. The proposal pits Chumney against other city council members.

A comprehensive list of WHBQ's local interest news stories and consumer reports is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Breaking News Updates

WHBQ broke into and/or preempted regularly-scheduled programming numerous times during the period covered by this report in order to bring its viewers breaking news or disaster information. This coverage included extended reporting on severe weather through the use of the station's real-time Doppler radar. In addition, WHBQ regularly inserted severe weather crawls into its programming in an effort to provide its viewers with vitally important local weather updates as quickly as possible.

Public Affairs Programming

WHBQ broadcasts the following public affairs programming as part of its local newscasts:

"Building Better Minds": a weekly feature that highlights positive stories of successes in education. Teachers who have found creative ways to reach students are profiled, as well as other programs that work in the local school systems.

"Mid-South's Most Wanted": this is a weekly feature which exposes some of the most wanted fugitives in the local area by law enforcement. The feature airs each Wednesday night during the station's 9 p.m. newscast and includes photographs, a feature of an unsolved crime, and a live phone bank staffed by community groups. Over the past four years, more than 250 criminals have been captured due to tips from WHBQ viewers.

"Fight the Blight": an on-going series of reports about abandoned property that threatens neighborhoods.

In addition, WHBQ broadcasts a variety of other local programming of interest to the viewers in its community. For example, the station has broadcast special programs and ceremonies featuring concerts by the Memphis Symphony Orchestra. In addition, the station aired a documentary in 2004 focusing on the 1973 Memphis State basketball team. WHBQ also airs several religious programs each week.

Political Coverage

WHBQ has devoted extensive time to coverage of political issues important to its viewers. During the time period covered by this report, for instance, WHBQ has aired special coverage of a city council forum, a town hall meeting on crime, a public utility public forum and meetings regarding the Memphis City Public Schools budget planning. In addition, for the two-week sample time period running September 13-27, 2004, the station aired approximately 100 minutes of political coverage during its newscasts. Exhibit B attached hereto includes a detailed list of WHBQ's political programming specials as well as the political issues covered in the station's local newscasts.

Public Service Announcements

WHBQ makes its air-time throughout the broadcast day available to public service announcements for a variety of causes, such as:

- * V-Chip
- * Cholesterol awareness
- * American Heart Association
- * National Mental Health
- * Tennessee Education Association
- * Fire safety awareness
- * Make-A-Wish Foundation
- * Rotary Initiative for Children

For each of two sample weeks (January 12-19 and June 14-21, 2004), WHBQ broadcast an average of more than 90 minutes of public service announcements – all without charging any of the organizations or causes for the time.

Participation in the Community

WHBQ's on-air newscasters and behind-the-scenes employees have made a commitment to participate in the Memphis community. The station's employees take part in a variety of events and causes in and around Memphis, such as:

- * Habitat for Humanity
- * Memphis City Schools: Our Children, Our Future mentoring program
- * Hands on Memphis Servathon
- * Junior Achievement Bowling on the River
- * Memphis Walk for the Homeless

WHBQ constantly gathers information about the needs and interests of the members of its community, particularly through the monthly meetings that the station hosts with community leaders. The discussions are informal and focus on a variety of issues, including child abuse, crime/gang violence in schools, education, parenting, and health issues. A diverse group of organizations have attended these meetings, including representatives of Porter Leath Children's Center, Make-A-Wish Foundation, The Child Advocacy Center, Yo! Memphis (minority youth organization), Miracle Alternative Youth Services, United Housing, The Salvation Army, The Girl Scouts, and Hope House, among others.
