Local Newscasts and Key Stories

Provided below is a brief summary of important local news stories that WITI has covered recently within its local news broadcasts:

- * **Education Funding for Schools:** Is money the answer to improving the way math is taught at Milwaukee public schools? The National Science Foundation thinks it takes 20 million dollars. FOX 6's Gus Gnorski shows you that's how much MPS is getting.
- * **Public Health Costs:** State Senator Dave Hansen says if the pharmaceutical companies don't like the competition from Canada they have to make pricing changes. Canada Drug Service Wisconsin is part of a franchise – and more are expected to open in the state.
- * **Neighborhood Stabilization:** Metcalfe Park could soon see a multi-million dollar change. Two million dollars in federal money is on the way. It's in an effort to help reduce the violence there and increase residents' quality of life. FOX 6's Dawn Hasbrouck has the story.
- * **Education Funding for Schools, Student Performance:** Milwaukee trails the nation in the percentage of black students who graduate from high school for the third year in a row. Education reporter Joanne Williams talks with the Superintendent of Milwaukee's schools to see how he plans to close this graduation gap.
- * **Economy New Business Developments & Job Creation:** What do you worry about? New numbers show more people in Wisconsin are concerned about jobs. For the first time in ten years, unemployment is a big worry in Wisconsin – mostly for Green Bay and here in Milwaukee. New research shows unemployment comes in second on a survey of the most important state problems.

Breaking News Updates

WITI broke into and/or preempted regularly-scheduled programming on numerous occasions during the period covered by this report in order to bring its viewers breaking news or disaster information. This coverage included extended reporting on tornado warnings and other severe weather, amber alerts, school closings, and other emergencies. In addition, WITI regularly inserted severe weather crawls into its programming in an effort to provide its viewers with vitally important local weather updates as quickly as possible.

Public Affairs Programming

WITI broadcasts has undertaken extensive projects like the Bully Project – a groundbreaking program designed to better understand the problem of school bullying and to develop strategies to reduce it. The project works closely with area schools, students, parents, teachers, mental-health professionals and local leaders to create a community-based program that addresses a community-wide problem.

In early April 2004, more than 13,000 students and hundreds of teachers from 63 schools completed detailed surveys about bullying. Survey results were released in May 2004, providing important information about school bullying, its possible causes and potential solutions. More than 300 teachers attended the FOX 6 Bully Project forum on September 20, 2004. It was a free two-hour session with national experts. FOX 6 has aired more than 300 PSAs supporting the Bully Project and a series of news stories have been broadcast on the subject.

In addition, WITI profiles a child every week as part of its Adoption Connection series and promotes other local philanthropic projects. WITI also locally produces several sports and holiday specials covering items of interest to the community.

Political Coverage

WITI has devoted extensive coverage to political issues important to its viewers. During a sample two-week time period, for example, WITI aired pieces on the presidential campaign and several local campaigns. The station also provided coverage of local debates and profiled 10 candidates for mayor. Exhibit B attached hereto includes a detailed list of WITI's political programming specials as well as the political issues covered in the station's local newscasts.

Public Service Announcements

WITI makes its air-time throughout the broadcast day available to public service announcements for a variety of causes, such as:

- FOX 6 Salutes Black History Month. Spots profiled local African-Americans named on local buildings including Sarah Scott Middle School, Isaac Coggs Health Center, and Felmers Chaney Center. The series of PSAs started airing in January 2004.
- FOX 6 Be a Reader. Series continued with a focus on summer reading. PSAs were created encouraging kids to read throughout the summer. This was in partnership with the Milwaukee Public Library and addressed the issue of education.
- Other local organizations receiving PSA time: First Stage Milwaukee, Adoption Resources of Wisconsin, Task Force on Family Violence, Second Harvest of Wisconsin, Junior Achievement of Wisconsin, United Performing Arts Fund, Ozaukee Humane Society, Gathering on the Green, Partnership for Drug Free America, St. Ann Center and others.
- Paid PSAs. Major campaigns with paid PSAs are: Coats for Kids, the Holiday Toy Chest, Read Across America, Make a Wish Run to Fiesta, and Second Harvest Hike for Hunger.
- WITI has also worked with several local organizations to produce PSAs to meet their specific needs and help educate the community. The station continues to air these PSAs.
 - Dec 2003 -- FOX 6 produced a spot for the local American Legion about proper destruction of flags and spots for the Task Force on Family Violence.
 - October 2003 -- FOX 6 produced two spots for Junior Achievement of Wisconsin.
 - Sept 2003 -- Produced three PSAs for Second Harvest of Wisconsin.

Participation in the Community

WITI's on-air newscasters and behind-the-scenes employees have made a commitment to participate in the Milwaukee community. The station's employees take part in a variety of events in and around the city.

- * FOX 6 employees serve on United Way, Shorewood BID, Junior Achievement and Heart Association Boards
- * On average, 3 community appearances are made each week by FOX 6 news anchors/reporters.

A comprehensive list of the station's participation in the community is attached as Exhibit C hereto.

WITI also seeks community input. Communication with the community consists of meetings with both individuals and groups regarding various issues. In addition, FOX 6 receives hundreds of e-mails every day from viewers giving input. FOX 6 also attended the "formal" Milwaukee broadcast ascertainment October 28 & 29, 2003, and April 14 & 15 2004. Speakers come in every 30-minutes from local organizations. Some of the groups who spoke to the station:

KMSP airs **27.0** hours of local news each week, at the following times:

Monday – Friday, 5 a.m. – 9 a.m.

Monday – Sunday, 9 p.m. – 10 p.m.

WFTC airs an additional 3.5 hours per week, Monday – Sunday, 10 p.m. – 10:30 p.m.

Both stations regularly address community concerns as part of their daily newscasts. KMSP, a FOX station, has a strong investigative unit that regularly airs hard-hitting stories that expose problems, corruption, and malfeasance within the community. In addition, the Investigators unit looks into many consumer concerns, such as the dangers of side impact car crashes, rollover dangers of ATVs, and the flammability of children's down jackets. WFTC, a UPN station, has an Up Close unit that has reported on consumer and health issues, such as ADD in adults, homelessness, bullying, and mold in the home. Provided below is a brief summary of important local news stories that KMSP and WFTC have covered recently within their local news broadcasts:

- * *Education* – Minority groups were upset over the selection of the new Minneapolis superintendent.
- * *Transportation* – News investigators taught viewers how to survive a rollover car crash.
- * *Education* – Story discussed the various proposals for new social studies standards in Minneapolis schools.
- * *Health Care* – Report discussed the rise of the Dutch Elm disease in Minnesota and provided informatoiin on prevention and cures.
- * *State Resources* – Story detailed the millions of dollars in unclaimed money held by the state and discussed how viewers can find additional information and make claims.

A detailed list of the stations' local interest news stories is attached as Exhibit A attached hereto.

Breaking News Updates

Each of KMSP and WFTC broke into and/or preempted regularly-scheduled programming numerous times during the period covered by this report in order to bring

its viewers breaking news or disaster information. KMSP's coverage included extended reporting on severe weather, such as tornado watches and thunderstorm warnings, as well as developing local stories. For example, the station interrupted regular programming to cover shootings at a local school and at a government center. Similarly, WFTC provided its viewers with numerous severe weather warnings. Both stations also participate in the amber alert program in an effort to help find missing children.

Public Affairs Programming

KMSP has partnered with a University of Minnesota journalism professor who received a grant to increase television coverage of health care issues in the state. The station has taken a three-pronged approach: investigative pieces, daily news coverage and ½ hour specials that air quarterly. Some of the recent topics covered have included: the cost of health insurance, the new Medicare discount card, and health care for retirees.

In addition, both KMSP and WFTC air a variety of other local programming of interest to the viewers in Minneapolis. For example, KMSP was the home of the High School Tournaments in 2003-04. The station's coverage included four days of boys hockey, one day of girls hockey, three days each of girls and boys basketball, and one day of prep football. In addition, the station also broadcast 25 Minnesota Wild hockey games, plus pre- and post-season specials. KMSP also aired pre- and post-game specials during the Minnesota Twins trips to the baseball playoffs each of the past two years. The station also aired its four-hour morning newscast live from the State Fair for seven days in August. WFTC, meanwhile, aired several news specials regarding Dru Sodjin, a special report regarding a bus strike, and 35 Minnesota Timberwolves games.

Political Coverage

Both KMSP and WFTC have devoted extensive time to coverage of political issues important to their viewers. During the time period covered by this report, for instance, the stations produced a series of stories following a focus group of undecided Minnesota voters, examining how they reacted to political events during the presidential campaign. The stations also have covered a number of Minnesota political issues during their newscasts, including: new sports stadiums, school standards, health care costs, death penalty, sex offender punishment, homelessness, state spending cutbacks, drinking in the State Capitol, and handgun conceal and carry. In addition, KMSP employs former Minnesota Gov. Arne Carlson year-round as a political analyst.

Public Service Announcements

KMSP and WFTC make their air-time throughout the broadcast day available to public service announcements for a variety of causes, such as:

For each of two sample weeks (January 12-19 and June 14-21, 2004), WFTC broadcast an average of 102 minutes of public service announcements – all without charging any of the organizations or causes for the time. Similarly, during the same two weeks, KMSP broadcast an average of 48 minutes of public service announcements without charge.

Participation in the Community

Both KMSP's and WFTC's on-air newscasters and behind-the-scenes employees have made a commitment to participate in the Minneapolis community. The stations' employees take part in a variety of events and causes in and around Minneapolis, such as:

KMSP and WFTC constantly gather information about the needs and interests of the members of their community, particularly by taking into account information that they receive from the Twin Cities Broadcast Ascertainment Group. The group meets quarterly with community leaders from throughout the stations' viewing area. Speakers at the group's recent surveys have represented a wide variety of interests, including business, government, elderly, environment and minorities. The stations' news staffs also regularly gather information about topics of interest from sources and from their interaction with members of the community.

A comprehensive list of the stations' participation in the community is attached as Exhibit B hereto.

EXHIBIT A – Local News Stories

KMSP has a strong investigative unit that regularly does hard-hitting stories that expose problems, corruption, and malfeasance within the community. In addition, the Investigators unit looks into many consumer concerns, such as the dangers of side impact car crashes, rollover dangers of ATVs, and the flammability of children's down jackets. On WFTC, the Up Close unit has reported on consumer and health issues such as ADD in adults, homelessness, bullying, and mold in the home. Provided below is a brief summary of important local news stories that WNYW has covered recently within its local news broadcasts:

- * Coverage of a special ceremony held in lower Manhattan to return the remains of African slaves to a burial ground where the bodies were unearthed 12-years ago;
- * Hearings into the blackout of 2003 – what happened to throw most of the Northeast and parts of Canada into the dark;
- * Story about the New York Police Department – the cops were accused of being lax in responding to a group of teens who were the victims of a racial attack on Staten Island;
- * Report concerning a backlash from homeless advocates who say the city and the courts are being too tough on the area's homeless population;
- * Coverage of a protest involving about 150 people who braved the snow to object to a Metropolitan Transportation Authority proposal to cut down the number of elevator operators in Washington Heights, jeopardizing safety;
- * Story about the fire department's counseling service, which is reportedly treating more than twice as many cases of alcohol or drug abuse that it was at the beginning of last year.

Breaking News Updates

WNYW broke into and/or preempted regularly-scheduled programming at least 57 times during the period covered by this report in order to bring its viewers breaking news or disaster information. This coverage included extended reporting on Hurricane Isabel and other severe weather, amber alerts, the Staten Island Ferry disaster, the New York's 9-11 memorial and a number of terrorism related warnings and alerts. In addition, WNYW

inserted severe weather crawls into its programming more than 475 times in an effort to provide its viewers with vitally important local weather updates as quickly as possible.

Public Affairs Programming

WNYW broadcasts "Good Day Street Talk" for 30 minutes every Saturday. The program provides viewers with topical discussions on the hottest news items of the week. "Good Day Street Talk" focuses on the issues that affect New York's diverse ethnic communities. Some of the key topics covered on the program during the time period covered by this report include:

- * 9th Annual "The Maafa" event addressing slave trade and its after-effects;
- * How working parents handle the problem of "home alone" kids;
- * The 25th anniversary of Pope John Paul II's election to the Papacy;
- * Update and debate on New York's tough new smoking law;
- * Various health care issues;
- * Discussion of same-sex marriage; and
- * Discussion of the problems facing New York City schools, and what can be done to make them work.

In addition, WNYW has aired a variety of other local programming of interest to the viewers in its community. For example, the station airs a Sunday Mass each week for those viewers unable to attend religious services in person. WNYW also produces a weekly sports program that focuses on New York teams, as well as a number of special one-time programs when a New York team reaches the playoffs.

Political Coverage

WNYW has devoted extensive time to coverage of political issues important to its viewers. During the time period covered by this report, for instance, WNYW has aired special live coverage of several of President Bush's speeches and news conferences as well as live coverage of the U.S. government's 9-11 hearings. In addition, WNYW provided extensive air-time to both the Republican and Democratic national conventions, with coverage including not only candidates' and supporters' speeches, but also news analysis and interviews with an eye toward issues that particularly affect New Yorkers. WNYW also provided live coverage of New Jersey Gov. James McGreevey's resignation speech. The station also covers political issues during its local newscasts. For the two-week sample time period running September 13-27, 2004, for instance, the station aired more than 72 minutes of political coverage during its newscasts. Exhibit B attached hereto includes a detailed list of WNYW's political programming specials as well as the political issues covered in the station's local newscasts.

Public Service Announcements

WNYW makes its air-time throughout the broadcast day available to public service announcements for a variety of causes, such as:

New York and New Jersey voters went to the polls and made some heavy decisions. One of those decisions was a slap in the face to Mayor Bloomberg. He wanted to do away with party primaries. Length: 2:00

New Yorkers were urged to get a flu shot now that the bug has been detected in all five boroughs and appears to be spreading.

GOOD WEEKEND FOR RETAIL STORES

Issues: Business and Economy

It was a good weekend for retail stores as the holiday shopping season officials kicked off this Thanksgiving weekend.

FIRST SIGNIFICANT WINTER STORM ON WAY

Issues: Environment

Road departments around New Jersey are checking their plows and loading their salt trucks. Forecasters say the first significant winter storm of the season will bear down on Mid-Atlantic States through Saturday. Winter weather advisories have gone out to many counties in the area.

DON'T PUT THOSE SNOW SHOVELS AWAY YET

Issues: Environment

A new design for the Freedom Tower at the World Trade Center site gracefully slopes into a spire rising 1,776 feet, echoing the State of Liberty.

TERROR ALERT

Issues: Terrorism

American intelligence officials have given new warnings to security personnel in New York on possible terrorist threats during the holiday season. The officials said city and state law enforcement officials should be aware of a recent increase in electronic messages intercepted among people associated with Al Qaeda.

COUNTERTERRORISM MEASURES STEPPED UP IN NY

Issues: Terrorism

Mayor Bloomberg says counter-terrorism measures will be stepped up throughout the city during the holiday season, but not because of a specific terrorist threat.

Organizers say they're hoping for 50,000 marchers at today's protest to mark the one-year anniversary of the start of the Iraq war. Police say they'll keep order and prevent a repeat of the chaos at protests a year ago – which ended with 91 arrests and 17 police officers injured.

CANCER SCAM FROM BEHIND BARS

Jason Vale, who claims apple and apricot seeds cure cancer is in jail for selling the seeds as a cancer cure. Fox 5 talks with him at length. AOL sued him for selling the seeds using their service. The FDA nailed him in an undercover sting operation. Vale claims he uses the cure and it works for him. He claims a small tumor can be cured in two weeks. In jail he doesn't have access to the seeds. The FDA warns consumers that apple and apricot seeds contain cyanide and can poison you.

AMTRAK SECURITY

In light of the successful terrorist attack on the trains in Madrid, Spain, Senator Joe Biden is lobbying for more security on Amtrak. He says the trains are targets. Federal officials warned police that terrorist might try to bomb trains or buses in major American cities this summer. Fox went undercover to see if security had been beefed up. Mary Garafalo reports no I.D. required to board, luggage and backpacks go unchecked and remain unattended at either end of the train car. Compare that to the billions spent on airline safety. But, he points out, a full Amtrak train has more passengers than a full 747. Experts recommend more dogs and uniformed officers but the cheapest line of defense is a vigilant passenger.

The bizarre case of New Jersey's stolen aluminum guardrails may be solved. Sections of the metal guardrails were disappearing from the New Jersey Turnpike and other roadways. Benetiz was selling the rails to a junkyard in Paterson and using the money to buy drugs. The junkyard was charged with receiving stolen goods.

Funeral arrangements for the 60-year-old Cunningham were incomplete at this time.
