

RE: Docket #s98-120, 99-360: FCC, Spectrum Giveaway, and Public Airways

Dear Chairman Powell,

I oppose the FCC's proposed plans to award every U.S. television broadcaster a huge historic giveaway of the digital spectrum.

This spectrum giveaway should be for local access! There is not enough competition in the television market, despite the number of channels available.

Cable companies would be required to provide the public access to all these new channels, owned by companies such as General Electric, Disney, Viacom, Sinclair and News Corp. Essentially how many Disney, HBO, CNN, and MTV stations do Americans really want or rather are **forced** to view? A perfect example of this hegemony is the upcoming "news worth" documentary on John Kerry by the Sinclair Broadcasting Group.

Basically the Commission has failed to clarify how these broadcasters would serve "public interest" and support our market-based economy. Broadcasters should be denied their request for multiple channel distribution on cable.





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

I thank you for allowing me to comment on this issue and pray that you will continue to support the K-LOVE station on stations in my area.

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

It has come to our attention that the Federal Communications Commission is considering expanding Low Power FM service. If LPFM service is expanded, new LPFM stations could take priority over current FM Translator Service, which is alarming to us. This means that we might not be able to hear a wonderful radio network which airs on an FM Translator in our Denver, Colorado area. We listen to the K-Love Radio Network on the 91.1 FM station here in the Denver area.

The K-Love Radio Network serves a vital need in our family, since its programming is family-oriented and encouraging. Our children enjoy listening to the music on this radio network as much as we do, and we know that they won't be hearing anything objectionable when this radio station is playing in our house and in our car.

If K-Love was to be displaced by a LPFM station, it would be detrimental to our family, as well as to our community, since we know many other families who also choose to listen to this radio station over the others available in the Denver area. 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



I am writing to express my concern regarding the possibility of replacing my favorite radio station (K-Love) with a LPFM broadcaster.

My family of six listens to K-Love almost all the time the radio is on. There are occasions when we want to hear the President speak, or listen to a college game, but all in all, the radio is on about 12 hours each day and usually to K-Love.

In fact, K-Love has been a tremendous source of support to me as a listener. When we had our three boys within 3 ½ years, I thought I would lose it! K-Love was a support to me by encouraging me with uplifting music, by helping me keep going even when things were tough, and believe me, there are plenty of moments with three young boys that can put you over the edge! ☺

In the last decade, K-Love has become a friend to me, helping me not only with my mothering skills, but also in my marriage and my personal development. Our marriage has endured many problems and issues, and yet I could always count on K-Love to be a tremendous source of strength... like a friend who keeps whispering behind you, "Go ahead, you can do it. I'm right here!" I have called at least twice, in fact, with prayer requests when I felt like I didn't have anyone else to turn to.

There are other local stations that are available to me, but I prefer K-Love above them because of the format, the music, and the constant flow of positive support, without the interruption of commercials. I feel like I am receiving all day long from K-Love. When I listen to other stations, I feel like I am listening for hope or encouragement, and then feel like I'm being taken from when commercials come on to try to snag my pocketbook. It's so nice to have my guard down and just receive from my favorite station!

In addition, this is the only station I feel safe letting my kids listen to. They love hearing songs they learn at church or from us. They start dancing or doing the motions to songs that help them in their growth instead of pushing them into phases that are inappropriate for them. It's great for all of us!


