I understand that the Commission has received input from several communities and groups regarding our commitment to the serving the public. As an industry, I feel we've done an inadequate job in informing both the Commission and the public on how we've fulfilled our mandate to serve the public interest. I wanted to file an example of how our radio stations are an integral part of our community.

- 1) **Local News:** Our four radio stations devote over 100 minutes each week to providing local news coverage and countless hours of time for severe weather coverage each week. Each newscast provides news of note specifically to Wichita Falls and is done in cooperation with one of our local television stations.
- 2) **Local Public Affairs:** Each station in our cluster devotes hours upon hours of public service time in live on-air announcements, including radiothons, PSA's and website space. The stations also feature a weekly 30-minute, locally produced public affairs show, which is simulcast on all four stations each Sunday morning at 7. The numerous plaques and letters of commendation speak to the public's perception of our job in the community. In addition, our morning show on the NewsTalk outlet features live local interviews each morning with community leaders of non-profit groups.
- 3) **Emergency Programming:** Wichita Falls sits in an interesting area for weather. As one of the first stops in "Tornado Alley," Wichita Falls is subject to many weather emergencies throughout the year. Each station is staffed during any emergency weather situation and an "on call" list is always ready for unexpected emergencies. Through our partnership with a local television station, our listeners not only get the information they need via audio...they have a "word picture" of each

storm. During winter weather, the station's award-winning "Operation Snowwatch" promises local announcements and cancellations each ten minutes throughout the morning. The station has EAS links to the National Weather Service and automatically forwards warnings to the broadcast area. We have a P-1 and P-2 station in our cluster. In the event of local emergencies, our cluster has an automatic link to the "Amber Alert" system and is working with the City of Wichita Falls on an "instant alert" system, which would enable the city to override programming for local emergencies.

- 4) **Political Programming** NewsTalk 1290 provides local candidates airtime on a non-paid basis to talk about our leading issues. In addition, specially produced programming, such as a recent "Community Forum," featuring live phone calls and e-mails and simulcast on two of our stations, provides the community an opportunity to "sound off" on the issues of the day.
- 5) **Civic, Cultural and Other Community-Responsive Programming:** NewsTalk 1290 devotes four hours of its Sunday programming for an exclusively "Spanish" broadcast. "Radio Tejano" is in its 10th year on the air. We also provide live coverage of local sports and have devoted countless hours of "free" remotes for non-profit groups who have weekend events.
- 6) **Music:** KBZS, our rock station, schedules "Local Licks," each Thursday afternoon. This is a chance for local bands to showcase their abilities by performing live on the radio. For some groups, this is their first airplay and is exciting for each of us. In addition, we have made the commitment to decrease our commercial load in the new year to provide up to an additional hour of music entertainment each day!
- 7) **Station Participation in Community Activities:** We are an important partner for community groups. Each year, KWFS-FM and KNIN-FM performs the "Children's Miracle Network" radiothon; a 36-hour live broadcast which benefits the local children's hospital. It is performed without compensation for station personnel and the cluster donates cash in addition to thousands of dollars of airtime for the cause. KWFS-FM also hosts a 10-hour radiothon for Hospice each December, which has raised over a half million dollars and always free of charge. Our Director of Programming serves as Chairman of the Board. This year, our cluster sponsored over a half dozen "walks" or "runs," and served as the steering committee and corporate sponsor for the MS Walk. The station also sponsors "Clear Channel Kids," a holiday-effort to purchase clothing for less fortunate students of the local school system. And our General Manager was this year's Campaign Chairman for the United Way drive.

And these activities merely scratch the surface of the plethora of programming which serves the community each day. For news, weather, entertainment and public service, we are the “one-stop shop” in Wichita Falls and North Texas. I believe if you ask anyone in Wichita Falls, “Does the local radio stations serve the public?”, the answer would be a resounding “Yes!”

I look forward to answering any questions you may have and stand “at your service.”







It has come to my attention that the FCC is considering expanding Low Power FM (LPFM) service, which may override local FM translators. Those overridden would include KLOVE, a wonderful Christian music station adored by countless thousands of listeners nationwide. I am writing in protest to this LPFM expansion, and in favor of established FM translators like KLOVE.

KLOVE's slogan is "Positive, Encouraging," and could not be more accurate. Their services include more than uplifting music; they also offer prayer support, and have helped bring 7,000 people to Christ in the last year alone. They support global and local mission charities as well.

KLOVE has been around for about seven years, and as a noncommercial station, has been completely listener-supported. I think the fact that so many listeners have seen fit to support KLOVE for so long should speak for itself. What's more, only about six percent of the KLOVE audience supports it financially. If that six percent is large enough to support the entire station, imagine how many people make up the other ninety-four percent! Imagine how many people would be negatively impacted by the disappearance of their beloved KLOVE station!

The media today is plagued with vulgar, offensive material, and there are very few stations which promote positive values and are safe for the entire family. America was conceived as one nation under God. Do not abandon this calling by allowing LPFM stations to usurp the broadcast frequencies of such worthwhile programming as that of KLOVE.

Dear FCC Personnel:

I've recently become aware that LPFM broadcast services may be given priority that would inhibit FM translator service which could wipe out the K-LOVE signal in my area. This proposal is extremely distressing to me as K-LOVE is absolutely the only station that I'm willing to listen to in my office and home, as well as in my car.

The K-LOVE music and messages are positive and uplifting, and have provided stability not only in my personal life, but in the lives of my children and friends for the past several years. Their programming, from early morning to late evening, gets me through each day. I feel that giving priority to other stations would be a detriment to the local community and deprive citizens of an important means of supportive worship. I have no doubt that every personal testimony broadcast, as well as K-LOVE'S music and prayer, touches someone's life every moment of every day.

Through my church affiliations, I know that hundreds of people in Cheyenne, WY, have their radios tuned to the K-LOVE station, and rely on the prayers and music that they hear to find inspiration and comfort throughout each busy week. Eliminating the option of the K-LOVE signal (if LPFM translators have priority) would take away some of the most rewarding times during their days.

All of us, especially our young children, need to hear nourishing and positive words, replenishing music, and especially the prayers of the four pastors at K-LOVE. Much of what is broadcast on local FM stations is vulgar, repulsive, and destructive. I am soon to become a grandmother, and I pray in earnest that my granddaughter will still have the choice to tune in to a radio station that will build up her confidence and help her feel safe in a troubled world, rather than listening to pop and rap, and lyrics that should be censored.

With five years of substitute teaching experience, I've observed that children are stumbling into a quagmire of ugliness delivered through our country's current media. I was deeply disturbed to hear that a proposal to expand LPFM services would take priority over the current FM stations, like Air 1. Air 1 provides an invaluable service to hundreds of thousands of listeners through its FM translator. The Christian music played on this station is upbeat, inspirational and truly lifts the heart of all who listen. I am a high school student, and Air 1 reaches the students in an extremely rare way. In the mainstream world of music, violent, offensive and often hopeless messages are communicated to teenage audiences through the music's lyrics. In comparison, Air 1 sends the message of God's love and hope into cities, homes, schools and work places all across America. The student's youth groups play Air 1 every week and I have seen first hand the impact it has on the students. Friends, acquaintances and strangers all have been affected by the positive messages Air 1 communicates, forsaking secular music and faithfully tuning into to Air 1 daily. The immense value of the station's musical content is indescribable. Air 1 takes special care to encourage its listeners to become better people and to draw near to God, and in return, has accumulated a large and diverse following, ranging from rehabilitated teenagers, parents, young adults, and even children.

Air 1 is not only an immeasurable blessing in my own life but it provides many necessary services to the general public. Air 1 is intimately connected with churches across America and informs music-lovers of up upcoming concerts, events and festivals. But the Air 1 radio station goes far above and beyond just playing contemporary music and informing the public of impending events; it provides twenty-four hour Christian support to Christians and non-Christians alike. A hotline where listeners can submit prayer requests any time, day or night, strengthens the Christian community and lets others know that someone does care about their life's struggles. The staff of Air 1 convenes multiple times per day to pray for the situations affecting their listeners. Five full-time pastors are on staff at Air 1, solely for the purpose of counseling those in distress. Listeners can call in and receive assistance from these trained professionals who provide aid for a broad spectrum of circumstances, ranging from domestic issues, addictions, felony offenses, suicide contemplation and depression. The unswerving availability of these resources and the competent assistance they provide are essential to a

healthy community and are especially cherished by those who would otherwise have no where else to turn for help.

Perhaps one of the services most appreciated by parents, is the child-friendly environment provided for under-age listeners. Air 1 broadcasts over the airwaves music and commentary free of profanity, crass humor, and raunchy dialogue. Attentive parents have no qualms about allowing this clean and moral station to reach the ears of their impressionable young ones. Air 1 also plays messages in between songs that entreat listeners to donate their time to improving the communities. These messages promote the active support of local homeless shelters and even an international mission to alleviate impoverished orphans in Cambodia. Some messages contain parental strategies suggested by Christian psychologists. Others share tips relating to marital health and conflict resolution. Some narratives relate a personal account of how Jesus Christ has dramatically impacted their lives. Needless to say, these messages uplift listeners and encourage them to improve not only the charitable institutions in their community and world-wide, but also the personal relationships in their own lives. Depriving the public of such powerful and constructive resources would be severely detrimental to individuals and the community as a whole.

If Air 1 were to be taken off the air, the general public would lose one of the last remaining sources of positive influence. There would be no music communicating the hope and joy of Jesus Christ to troubled teenagers. Youth groups would have no contemporary music to play at their gatherings. Parents would be deprived of the safe radio environment they have come to depend on for their children. Young adults would have no upbeat inspirational music to sing along with while driving. And the influential voices promoting community service and fraternity would forever be silenced. I can honestly not fathom how different my life and the lives of people in my acquaintance would be if Air 1 was not there to turn to. Please, in light of this radio station's importance, reconsider the proposed rule changes that would force Air 1 off the air. It means too much to too many, for Federal Communications Commission to ignore.
