
Dear Ms. Dortch:

On December 7, 2004, Ruth Milkman, of Lawler, Metzger & Milkman, counsel to T-Mobile, had separate telephone conversations with Scott Bergmann, Matt Brill, Chris Libertelli, and Jessica Rosenworcel, regarding the need for CMRS carriers to obtain access to unbundled network elements in order to compete to serve wireline residential customers. Also on December 7, 2004, A. Richard Metzger, Jr., of Lawler Metzger & Milkman, discussed the same topic with Dan Gonzalez via telephone. The discussion in all of these conversations was consistent with T-Mobile's previous written submissions in the above-referenced proceeding.
