


We talk to other people around the Modesto area who listen to K-Love and see a lot of their bumper stickers around. It would be sad if we could no longer listen to our favorite station.






I am a devoted listener to K-LOVE, a regional service heard on FM translators.





The popularity of K-LOVE is such that I can connect with a diverse range of people in my community—"Do you listen to K-LOVE?" is an instant conversation starter. 



We have also been financial supporters of this station because we believe in the positive programming they offer. I am 62 years old and Marilyn is 54.
2. If K-LOVE were to be displaced by an LPFM we are extremely concerned that there would be a huge gap left in the lives of many, many listeners, including us. 





Please keep the FM translators going strong. Do not weaken them because it would help anything.


