This is to inform you that, on January 5, 2005, in connection with the above-referenced applications, the undersigned, representing Motient, Inc., an investor in Mobile Satellite Ventures LP ("MSV"), along with Alex Good, CEO of MSV, Raj Singh, a member of MSV's Board of Directors, and [name redacted], CEO of [name of company redacted]<sup>1</sup> met with Edward Thomas and Julius Knapp, respectively Chief and Deputy Chief of the Office of Engineering & Technology. In addition, on the same day, the undersigned & Messrs. Good and [name redacted] met with John Muleta, Chief of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau.

The purpose of both meetings was to emphasize the importance to those financing MSV, both existing and potential, and the potential suppliers of technology to

MSV, of the Commission's resolving the Ancillary Terrestrial Component ("ATC") issues remaining after the issuance of the International Bureau's ATC licensing decision.<sup>2</sup> We outlined for the FCC participants in the meetings the many benefits that would flow to the public safety community and to the public at large from the full development of MSV's mobile communications system. In this regard, we stated that Inmarsat's objections to MSV's ATC proposal are groundless and urged quick approval of MSV's pending Petition for Reconsideration and rejection of Inmarsat's Application for Review of the International Bureau's recent licensing decision.
