On Wednesday, January 12, 2005, CTIA, the Wireless Association, Mike Altschul, Senior Vice President, General Counsel, and Chris Guttman-McCabe, Assistant Vice President, Regulatory Policy and Homeland Security at CTIA – The Wireless Association™, met with John Muleta, Chief, Cathy Seidel, Deputy Chief, Nicole McGinnis, Legal Advisor, Dorothy Conway, Associate Chief, Spectrum Management Resources and Technology Division, Brian Morenco, Acting Associate Chief, Public Safety and Critical Infrastructure Division, and Ramona Melson, Supervisory Attorney, Public Safety and Critical Infrastructure Division, all of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau. The parties discussed the requirements in the 800 MHz Order that “licensees operating cellular-architecture systems in or adjacent to the 800 MHz band (ESMR, Cellular A Band and Cellular B Band) establish, within thirty days of the effective date...a common electronic means of receiving initial notification of interference complaints from non-cellular 800 MHz licensees.” CTIA presented an overview of the industry’s efforts to establish that notification system.
