This is to inform you that, on January 27, 2005, in connection with the above-referenced applications, the undersigned, representing Motient, Inc., an investor in Mobile Satellite Ventures LP ("MSV"), spoke by telephone to Richard Engelman, Chief Engineer of the International Bureau, and Bryan Tramont, Chief of Staff to Chairman Michael K. Powell.

The purpose of the call was to alert Messrs. Engelman and Tramont to Inmarsat's tactic of attempting to foment interference concerns in the Department of Defense in an effort to slow down Commission resolution of the Ancillary Terrestrial Component ("ATC") issues remaining after the issuance of the International Bureau's ATC licensing decision.<sup>1</sup> The undersigned urged the importance of speedy resolution of these issues.
