


NSTN.^{2/} Both LCSI and NSTN have failed to disclose to the Commission that Lurya is an officer of NSTN, even when this fact was relevant to issues raised against them before the Commission.

In June of 2000, MRA filed an Informal Objection against two applications filed by NSTN, FCC File Nos. D141773 and D141774, and one application filed by LCSI, FCC File D141775. NSTN and LCSI were seeking authorizations for temporary fixed stations at the same three locations, operating on between 7 and 30 channels per station, and serving tens of thousands of
