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## CINGULAR WIRELESS LLC AND TRITON PCS HOLDINGS, INC. SEEK FCC CONSENT TO THE TRANSFER OF CONTROL OF LICENSES

WT Docket No. 05-26

### PLEADING CYCLE ESTABLISHED

**Petitions to Deny Due:** February 25, 2005  
**Oppositions Due:** March 7, 2005  
**Replies Due:** March 14, 2005

Triton License Newco, LLC ("Triton Newco"), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Triton PCS Holdings, Inc. ("Triton"), and AWS License Newco, LLC ("AWS Newco"), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Cingular Wireless LLC ("Cingular"), have filed two applications seeking approval, pursuant to Section 310(d) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended,<sup>1</sup> for the transfer of control of Personal Communications Services ("PCS") and common carrier fixed point-to-point microwave licenses. The Applicants seek Commission consent to transfer control of PCS licenses held by Triton Newco from Triton to Cingular, and PCS and ancillary microwave licenses held by AWS Newco from Cingular to Triton. As a result of the proposed spectrum exchange, Triton will acquire between 7.5 MHz and 20 MHz of PCS spectrum in Puerto Rico, the United States Virgin Islands, and parts of North Carolina and South Carolina,<sup>2</sup> and Cingular will acquire between 10 MHz and 50 MHz of PCS spectrum in parts of Virginia, North Carolina, and West Virginia.<sup>3</sup>

#### I. SECTION 310(d) APPLICATIONS

The following applications for consent to transfer control of PCS and microwave licenses granted pursuant to Parts 24 and 101 of the Commission's rules have been assigned the file numbers below:

## II. EX PARTE STATUS OF THIS PROCEEDING

Pursuant to section 1.1200(a) of the Commission's rules,<sup>4</sup> the Commission may adopt modified or more stringent *ex parte* procedures in particular proceedings if the public interest so requires. We announce that this proceeding will be governed by permit-but-disclose *ex parte* procedures that are applicable to non-restricted proceedings under section 1.1206 of the Commission's rules.<sup>5</sup>

Parties making oral *ex parte* presentations are directed to the Commission's statement re-emphasizing the public's responsibility in permit-but-disclose proceedings and are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must contain the presentation's substance and not merely list the subjects discussed.<sup>6</sup> More than a one- or two-sentence description of the views and arguments presented is generally required.<sup>7</sup> Other rules pertaining to oral and written presentations are set forth in section 1.1206(b) as well.<sup>8</sup> We urge parties to use the Electronic Comment Filing System ("ECFS") to file *ex parte* submissions.<sup>9</sup>

## III. GENERAL INFORMATION

The applications referenced herein have been found, upon initial review, to be acceptable for filing. The Commission reserves the right to return any application if, upon further examination, it is determined to be defective and not in conformance with the Commission's rules or policies. Final action on these applications will not be taken earlier than thirty-one days following the date of this Public Notice.<sup>10</sup>

Interested parties must file petitions to deny no later than **February 25, 2005**. Persons and entities that file petitions to deny become parties to the proceeding. They may participate fully in the proceeding, including seeking access to any confidential information that may be filed under a protective order, seeking reconsideration of decisions, and filing appeals of a final decision to the courts. Oppositions to such pleadings must be filed no later than **March 7, 2005**. Replies to such pleadings must be filed no later than **March 14, 2005**. All filings concerning matters referenced in this Public Notice should refer to **DA 05-168** and **WT Docket No. 05-26**, as well as the specific file numbers of the individual applications or other matters to which the filings pertain.

Under the Commission's current procedures for the submission of filings and other documents,<sup>11</sup> submissions in this matter may be filed electronically (*i.e.*, though ECFS) or by hand delivery to the Commission's Massachusetts Avenue location.

- **If filed by ECFS,**<sup>12</sup> comments shall be sent as an electronic file via the Internet to <http://www.fcc.gov/e-file/ecfs.html>. In completing the transmittal screen, commenters should include their full name, Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket number. Parties may also submit an electronic comment by Internet e-mail.
