On behalf of the Hastings, Nebraska, Economic Development Corporation, I write in support of the ALLTEL-Western Wireless merger. We believe this merger will be particularly good for rural customers.

We anticipate a number of benefits from the combining of these two companies. Some of those benefits include:

- The combined company will have the resources to speed deployment of advanced wireless service to rural areas. It will have a greater ability to procure at reasonable prices equipment and customer handsets necessary for high-speed wireless services, ensuring that rural businesses and consumers have access to the same cutting-edge services available to their urban and suburban counterparts.
- We understand that the transaction will expand the combined company's footprint to 33 states, eliminating roaming costs for the combined company's customers in many rural areas and increasing the number of "in-network" mobile phone users that customers can call for free.
- The deal will result in a combined company that will have a more significant regional presence. It will create a stronger competitor against the larger, nationwide wireless carriers and will provide expanded services in rural markets.
