Dear Ms. Dortch:

On May 10 and 11, 2005, Roger Sherman, counsel for Sprint Corporation (“Sprint”), Mary Jean Fell, counsel for Nextel Communications, Inc. (“Nextel”), and Steve Berman, outside counsel for Nextel, communicated with Sara Mechanic, Ben Freeman and Louis Peraertz of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau regarding the Data Requests transmitted to Sprint and Nextel on May 6, 2005 in the above-captioned proceeding. *See* Letter from Scott D. Delacourt, Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, to Larry Krevor, Nextel (May 6, 2005) (attaching Data Request); Letter from Scott D. Delacourt, Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, to Vonya McCann, Sprint (May 6, 2005) (attaching Data Request). In these communications, the representatives from Sprint and Nextel identified various technical issues relating to their respective data submissions. In response, Ms. Mechanic and Mr. Freeman provided a number of clarifications or modifications of the request, including the following:

- Sprint and Nextel do not have to provide data for zip codes in their respective billing systems that do not match any zip code contained in the “ZIP-FIPS” conversion file provided to the companies by the FCC.
- For the six zip codes in the ZIP-FIPS file provided by the FCC that are associated with more than one FIPS code, Sprint and Nextel can use the FIPS code associated with the larger state representation.

- Sprint and Nextel can delete Field 4 from their pricing data; instead, Sprint and Nextel should provide a Market-FIPS conversion file similar to the zip code-FIPS file provided by the FCC. For this Market-FIPS table, where a FIPS code is associated with more than one market, Sprint and Nextel can use the market with the greatest number of subscribers in that FIPS code.
