PETITION FOR RULE MAKING

Chisholm Trail Broadcasting Co. ("Chisholm Trail"), licensee of KNID(FM), Alva, Oklahoma, by its counsel, hereby submits this Petition for Rule Making, which proposes to (i) delete Channel 259C1 at Alva, Oklahoma and allot Channel 259C2 to Mustang, Oklahoma as that community's first local service, (ii) allot Channel 260C3 to Medford, Oklahoma as that community's first local service, and (iii) allot Channel 259C1 to Greensburg, Kansas as that community's first local service. If this Petition is granted, Chisholm Trail will file applications for Channel 259C2 at Mustang, Channel 260C3 at Medford, and Channel 259C1 at Greensburg, and construct the facilities as authorized. I. Station KNID(FM), Alva to Mustang, Oklahoma

1. As demonstrated in the Technical Exhibit, Channel 259C2 can be allotted to Mustang at the coordinates of 35-33-40 North Latitude, 97-50-40 West Longitude consistent with Section 73.207 of the Commission's Rules with respect to all existing and proposed domestic allotments and facilities.² See Figure 1. A 70 dBu signal can be provided to Mustang from the proposed reference coordinates. See Figure 2. The relocation of KNID(FM) from Alva to Mustang will result in a predicted net gain in population of 811,110 persons within the proposed KNID(FM) 60 dBu contour. See Figure 2. This proposal will not create any white or gray area. See Figure 3.

2. Chisholm Trail desires to change the community of license of KNID(FM) from Alva to Mustang under the guidelines set forth in *Amendment of the Commission's Rules Regarding Modification of FM and TV Authorizations to Specify a New Community of License*, 4 FCC Rcd 4870 (1989), *recons. granted in part*, 5 FCC Rcd 7094 (1990). There, the Commission stated that a station may change its community of license without subjecting the license to other

¹ The FM Table of Allotments indicates that Channel 260C1 is allotted to Alva. However, this channel was modified to 259C1 as a result of the *Memorandum Order and Opinion* in MM Docket No. 98-155. See 20 FCC Rcd 5761 (2005) (the "*Commission MO&O*").

² The channel study reveals a short spacing to Channel 259C3 at Tuttle, Oklahoma that was dismissed pursuant to the *Commission MO&O*. Chisholm Trail also notes that its proposal is in conflict with a proposal filed by Charles Crawford on July 19, 2004, to allot Channel 259A at Lexington, Oklahoma. However, Mr. Crawford's proposal is defective and should be dismissed. Mr. Crawford states in his petition that it was filed with the assumption that the proposal for Channel 259C3 at Tuttle had been dismissed. When Mr. Crawford filed, the proposal for Channel 259C3 at Tuttle had not been dismissed. Nevertheless, if the Commission does not dismiss Mr. Crawford's proposal, it should merge it into this proceeding because the proposals are in technical conflict.

expressions of interest if (1) the proposed allotment is mutually exclusive with the current allotment; (2) the current community of license will not be deprived of its only local service; and (3) the proposed arrangement of allotments is preferred under the Commission's allotment priorities. These criteria are met here. First, the proposed use of Channel 259C2 at Mustang is mutually exclusive with the current use of Channel 259C1 at Alva. *See* Figure 1. Second, Alva will not be deprived of its only local service because it will continue to be served by Stations KALV(AM), KTTL(FM), and KPAK(FM). Third, the provision of a first local service to Mustang (2000 U.S. Census population 13,156) under Priority 3 will result in a preferential arrangement of allotments over the retention of a fourth local service at Alva (2000 U.S. Census population 5,288) under Priority 4. *See Revision of FM Assignment Policies and Procedures*, 90 FCC 2d 88 (1982).

3. Alva is not located in an Urbanized Area. Mustang is located in the Oklahoma City, Oklahoma Urbanized Area. Therefore, this relocation implicates the Commission's policy regarding the migration of stations into urban areas. *See Headland, Alabama and Chattahoochee, Florida*, 10 FCC Rcd 10352 (1995) ("*Headland*"); *Faye and Richard Tuck*, 3 FCC Rcd 5374 (1988) ("*Tuck*"). In making the determination whether to award an urbanized community a first local service preference, the Commission will consider (1) the extent to which the station will provide service to the entire Urbanized Area, (2) the relative populations and proximity of the suburban and central city, and, most importantly, (3) the independence of the suburban community. *Tuck*, 3 FCC Rcd at 5377-78. In this case, from the proposed transmitter site, KNID(FM) would place a 70 dBu contour over 55% of the Oklahoma City Urbanized Area. Mustang's population (2000 U.S. Census 13,156) is 2.6% of that of Oklahoma City (2000 U.S. Census 506,132), and Mustang is located 21 kilometers from Oklahoma City. These figures are

similar to those of other suburban communities granted a first local preference. *See, e.g., Park City, Montana*, 19 FCC Rcd 2092, 2094 (2004) (Park City's population is less than 1% of that of Billings, and Park City is located 21 miles from Billings); *Ada, Newcastle and Watonga, Oklahoma*, 11 FCC Rcd 16896, 16899 (1996) (Newcastle's population is less than 1% of that of Oklahoma City, and Newcastle is located 15 miles from Oklahoma City). Nevertheless, the Commission has repeatedly stated that these factors are less important than evidence of independence. *See Headland*, 10 FCC Rcd at 10355. The following analysis of the eight *Tuck* factors demonstrates the independence of Mustang from Oklahoma City.

(1) ***Extent to which the residents of Mustang work in Mustang.*** According to the 2000 U.S. Census figures, 893 of the 6,571 employed individuals in Mustang, or 13.6%, work at their place of residence. *See* Exhibit 2. This percentage compares favorably with other independent communities. *See, e.g., Albemarle and Indian Trail, North Carolina*, 16 FCC Rcd 13876 (2001) (11.3% of working-age residents worked in community); *Coolidge and Gilbert, Arizona*, 11 FCC Rcd 3610 (1996) (13% of Gilbert's working population actually worked in Gilbert).

(2) ***Newspapers and other media that cover Mustang's local needs and interests.*** The *Mustang News* is the hometown newspaper for Mustang. It is published weekly and, in addition to home delivery, the paper can be viewed online at <www.mustangnews.info>. The *Mustang News* includes local news articles, local sports articles, local obituaries, local editorials and opinions, and local classifieds. *See* Exhibit 2.

(3) ***Community leaders and residents perceive Mustang as being separate from Oklahoma City.*** Mustang was settled as part of the Oklahoma land run of 1889.

It was named Mustang Township in 1890 and was officially platted as a town in 1901. In 1902 the railroad came to Mustang and throughout the early twentieth century business in Mustang centered around the railroad. Today, Mustang is one of the fastest growing cities in Oklahoma with a diverse economy. Mustang also has its own website at <www.cityofmustang.org>. See Exhibit 2.

(4) ***Mustang has its own local government and elected officials.*** The City of Mustang is governed by a Mayor and City Council, which meets in the Mustang Municipal Building on the first and third Tuesday of each month. The Mustang City Manager is responsible for the administration of Mustang. In addition to these public officials, the City of Mustang has the following departments: Planning and Zoning, Permits and Fees, Code Enforcement, Fire, Police, Parks and Recreation, Library, Senior Center, Public Works, and Sanitation. The City of Mustang also has its own municipal court. Finally, the Mustang Economic Development Authority is a public trust created to promote the development of industrial, manufacturing, retail, cultural and educational activities within the City of Mustang. It consists of four citizen volunteers, one City Council member and one city staff liaison. See Exhibit 2.

(5) ***Mustang has its own zip code and phone book.*** The zip code assigned to Mustang is 73064, and the U.S. Postal Service operates one office in Mustang. Transwestern publishes the Yukon-Mustang phone book which combines yellow and white page directories for the community of Mustang. See Exhibit 2.

(6) ***Mustang has its own commercial establishments and health facilities.*** Mustang is home to the Mustang Chamber of Commerce and a variety of businesses and commercial establishments. A number of local businesses identify with the community

by using “Mustang” in their name, including Mustang Alignment and Tire Shop, Mustang Animal Health Clinic, Mustang Automotive, Mustang Chiropractic Clinic, Mustang Developers Association, Mustang Electric, Mustang Flowers, Mustang Insurance, Mustang Muffler, Mustang Optical, Mustang Quick Lube, and Mustang Veterinary Hospital. *See Exhibit 2.*

Health care is provided to the community of Mustang by a number of sole practitioners. Mustang is also home to a number of religious organizations, including the Church of Christ, First Baptist Church of Mustang, Jehovah’s Witnesses Mustang Congregation, Mustang Assembly of God, and Mustang United Methodist Church. Community organizations in Mustang include the Mustang Lions Club. *See Exhibit 2.*

(7) *Mustang is a separate and distinct advertising market from Oklahoma City.* The *Mustang News* provides the businesses of Mustang with a place to advertise to the residents of Mustang without relying on the Oklahoma City advertising market. *See Exhibit 2.*

(8) *Mustang has its own schools, library, police department and fire department.* There are ten public schools in Mustang, which are administered by Mustang Public Schools. The schools include, Mustang Elementary, Mustang Middle School, Mustang Creek Elementary, Mustang North Middle School, and Mustang High School. The Mustang Public Library is located in the Mustang Town Center and provides the full range of library services to the community of Mustang. The Mustang Fire Department was established in the 1950s and the first Fire Chief was appointed in 1968. Today, the Department consists of 10 paid professionals and 25 volunteers. The

Mustang Police Department is administered by the Chief of Police and provides protection and enforcement services for the City of Mustang. *See Exhibit 2.*

4. Mustang is clearly independent of Oklahoma City and therefore deserving of a first local service. As demonstrated above, Mustang satisfies all of the independent community indicia required by *Tuck*.

II. Channel 260C3, Medford, Oklahoma

5. As a result of the proposed deletion of Channel 259C1 from Alva, Chisholm Trail proposes to allot Channel 260C3 at Medford, Oklahoma as that community's first local service. As demonstrated in the Technical Exhibit, Channel 260C3 can be allotted to Medford consistent with Section 73.207 of the Commission's Rules with respect to all existing and proposed domestic allotments and facilities. *See Figure 4.* A 70 dBu signal can be provided to Medford from the proposed reference coordinates. *See Figure 4.* In addition, the allotment of Channel 260C3 to Medford will result in a predicted net gain in population of 14,030 persons within the proposed 60 dBu contour. *See Figure 4.* Finally, this allotment will cover most of the area that would otherwise lose its third full time aural service as a result of the proposed deletion of Channel 259C1 from Alva.

6. Medford, Oklahoma enjoys the attributes that the Commission traditionally associates with a community. Medford is listed in the 2000 U.S. Census with a population of 1,172 and therefore is presumed to have the status of a community for allotment purposes. *See Arnold and Columbia, California, 7 FCC Rcd 6302 (1992).*

7. Medford is located in Grant County, Oklahoma and is situated along the Chisholm Trail. Medford is the county seat of Grant County, and the county offices, departments, and courts are located in Medford. The ZIP code assigned to Medford is 73759, and the U.S. Postal Service operates one branch in Medford. According to Dea Kretchmar, the

Medford City Manager, Medford was incorporated in 1893. The Medford city government operates under a manager/city council form of governance. The City Council is composed of five elected members who serve four-year terms. The City Manager is appointed by the City Council. Medford also has the following departments: water, streets, city clerk, fire, police, and library. The Medford School District I-54, which is composed of Medford Elementary School and Medford High School, is located in Medford. *See Exhibit 3.*

8. According to Ms. Kretchmar, Medford is home to approximately fifty businesses. A number of local businesses identify with the community by using “Medford” in their name, including Medford Family Clinic, Medford Flora, Medford Service Center and Medford Printing. Churches that are home to Medford include the St. Mary’s Catholic Church and the First Baptist Church. In addition, the Grant County Museum is located in Medford. *See Exhibit 3.*

9. If this Petition is granted, Chisholm Trail will file an application for Channel 260C3 at Medford and construct the facilities as authorized.

III. Channel 259C1, Greensburg, Kansas

10. As a result of the proposed deletion of Channel 259C1 from Alva, Chisholm Trail also proposes to allot Channel 259C1 at Greensburg, Kansas as that community’s first local service. As demonstrated in the Technical Exhibit, Channel 259C1 can be allotted to Greensburg consistent with Section 73.207 of the Commission’s Rules with respect to all existing and proposed domestic allotments and facilities. *See Figure 5.* A 70 dBu signal can be provided to Greensburg from the proposed reference coordinates. *See Figure 5.* In addition, the allotment of Channel 259C1 to Greensburg will result in a predicted net gain in population of 30,120 persons within the proposed 60 dBu contour. *See Figure 5.*

11. Greensburg, Kansas enjoys the attributes that the Commission traditionally associates with a community. Greensburg is listed in the 2000 U.S. Census with a population of

1.574 and therefore is presumed to have the status of a community for allotment purposes. *See Arnold and Columbia, California*, 7 FCC Rcd 6302 (1992).

12. Greensburg is the county seat of Kiowa County, Kansas. Greensburg was named for the stagecoach driver D. R. Cannonball Green in the late 19th century. The ZIP code assigned to Greensburg is 67054, and the U.S. Postal Service operates an office in Greensburg. Greensburg is administered by a Mayor and seven member City Council. In addition Kiowa County has a number of offices in Greensburg. Greensburg also has its own airport, ambulance service, fire department, police department, and library. The schools in Greensburg include, Delmer Day Elementary School, Greensburg Junior High School, and Greensburg High School. *See Exhibit 4.*

13. Greensburg is also home to the Greensburg Chamber of Commerce and a number of other businesses and commercial establishments. A number of these businesses identify with the community by using "Greensburg" in their name, including Greensburg Collision and Auto Glass, Greensburg Farm Supply, Greensburg Oilfield Services, Greensburg State Bank, and Greensburg Family Practice. Other businesses in Greensburg include, Daylight Donuts, Pizza Hut, Pedlars Restaurant, Best Western, and Pleasant View Motel. Health care is provided to the residents of Greensburg by the Kiowa County Memorial Hospital, which is located in Greensburg. The churches located in Greensburg include, Assembly of God, First Baptist, Greensburg Mennonite, Peace Lutheran, and St. Joseph Catholic. *See Exhibit 4.*

14. If this Petition is granted, Chisholm Trail will file an application for Channel 259C1 at Greensburg and construct the facilities as authorized.


IV. Conclusion

For the foregoing reasons the Commission should (i) delete Channel 259C1 from Alva, Oklahoma and allot Channel 259C2 to Mustang, Oklahoma as that community's first local

service, (ii) allot Channel 260C3 to Medford, Oklahoma as that community's first local service, and (iii) allot Channel 259C1 to Greensburg, Kansas as that community's first local service. Chisholm Trail reiterates that if the Commission allots Channel 259C2 to Mustang, Channel 260C3 to Medford, and Channel 259C1 to Greensburg, it will file applications and construct the facilities as authorized. The Commission should promptly issue a Notice of Proposed Rule Making as described herein.









FIGURE 3 - OTHER SERVICES TO KNID LIC


KNID RM - Move to Mustang, OK

- The City’s sales tax rate is 4.0%. The State levies a 4.5% tax rate on sales. Canadian County levies a sales tax of .35%.


- **Industrial Financing**

- The Oklahoma Finance Authorities provide low interest financing through the issuance of general obligation bonds. The loans are established at 300 basis points over cost. In a first mortgage position the loan can be up to \$1.25 million. Lease income from the facility is used to amortize the bonds.







Sanitation

The City of Mustang provides sanitation service to approximately 5,250 residential and commercial customers.

On July 1, 2004, the City of Mustang began contracting with IESI to provide residential and commercial service. In addition, we began utilizing the OEMA landfill for disposal of household and commercial waste.

Curbside sanitation service is provided to all residential customers once per week. In addition, the city holds curbside bulk pickup each spring. The city holds a fall clean-up each September which does not include curbside service. For bulk waste throughout the year, a roll-off container is located at Public Services, 520 SW 59th, for residents to drop off their bulk garbage. The container is accessible during normal office hours, Monday through Friday 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. You must stop by the office and show proof of residence and your current City of Mustang utility bill. All bulk drop-off items must meet the restrictions for spring cleanup and be placed in the container. Dumping on the ground around the container is not allowed and is considered littering.

Any questions concerning your sanitation service should be directed to City Hall, 376-4521.
