

SUMMARY

OKAN COMMUNITY RADIO respectfully requests that the Commission amend the FM Table of Allotments (Section 73.202(b)) of the Rules as follows:

CITY	PRESENT ALLOTMENT	PROPOSED ALLOTMENT
Sedan, Kansas	---	259C3
Alva, Oklahoma	259C1	260C1
Tuttle, Oklahoma	---	259C3

Additionally, OKAN respectfully requests that the Commission order the modification of the license for Radio Broadcast Station KNID(FM), Alva, Oklahoma (FCC Facility ID No. 37123) (hereafter "*KNID*") for KNID to operate on FM Channel 260 in order to permit the first local aural transmission services at Sedan, Kansas, and Tuttle, Oklahoma.

Sedan, Kansas, is the county seat of Chautauqua County, Kansas, and the allotment of Channel 259 to that community would be its first aural transmission service.

Tuttle, Oklahoma, is an incorporated city located in Grady County, Kansas, and the allotment of Channel 259 to Tuttle would be its first aural transmission service. The Commission previously has determined that Tuttle warranted the allotment of Channel 259 there, but rescinded that determination based upon the absence of a continuing expression of interest in the allotment.

Both Sedan, Kansas, and Tuttle, Oklahoma possess Sedan, Kansas, possesses the requisite social, economic and cultural components that are commonly associated with community status, and warrant the allotments. See, FM Table of Allotments (East Hemet, CA) 67 RR 2d 146, 147 (1989).

Concomittant with the proposed allotment of FM Channel to Sedan, Kansas, and Tuttle, Oklahoma, OKAN requests that the Commission Order Chisholm Trail Broadcasting Co., Inc., the licensee of Radio Broadcast Station KNID(FM), Alva, Oklahoma (FCC Facility ID No. 37123) to show cause why the license for KNID should not be modified to specify Channel 260C1 at Alva, Oklahoma, in lieu of Channel 259C1 at Alva.

PETITION FOR RULEMAKING

OKAN COMMUNITY RADIO ("OKAN"), by its attorneys and pursuant to Section 1.401 and consistent with Section 1.420 of the Commission's Rules, hereby requests that the Commission amend the FM Table of Allotments (Section 73.202(b)) of the Rules as follows:

Additionally, OKAN respectfully requests that the Commission order the modification of the license for Radio Broadcast Station KNID(FM), Alva, Oklahoma (FCC Facility ID No. 37123) (hereafter “KNID”) for KNID to operate on FM Channel 260 in order to permit the first local aural transmission services at Sedan, Kansas, and Tuttle, Oklahoma. In support thereof, the following is respectfully submitted.^{2/}

I. DISCUSSION

A. *Technical Considerations.* As demonstrated by the attached Technical Statement (appended hereto as **Exhibit A**) the proposed allotments of Channel 259 to Sedan, Kansas, as well as to Tuttle, Oklahoma, are mutually exclusive with the currently authorized allotment for KNID. The substitution of Channel 260 for Channel 259 at Alva, Oklahoma, however, will permit two new local services for Sedan, Kansas, and for Tuttle, Oklahoma.

The Engineering Statement reflects that each of the proposed reallocations complies with the requirements of the Commission’s rules and will not subject KNID to any competing expressions of interest. *See Modification of FM and TV Authorizations to Specify a New Community of License.* 4 FCC Rcd 4870 (1989), 66 RR 2d 877, as modified by *Amendment of the Commission’s Rules Regarding Modification of FM*

and TV Authorizations to Specify a New Community of License, 5 FCC Rcd 7094, 68 RR 2d 644 (1990) (hereafter the “*Modification Order*”). Each of the proposed reallocations will provide the requisite 70 dBu coverage to the respective principal communities of Sedan, Kansas, as well as Alva and Tuttle, Oklahoma. No material loss of service to Alva, Oklahoma, will result from the change proposed here, and the channel reallocations will afford a first local transmission facility to both Sedan, Kansas, and Tuttle, Oklahoma. Because the proposed channel substitution of Alva, Oklahoma, does not involve a site change, no existing KNID listeners should be deprived of reception service.

B. Policy Considerations. The allotment of FM Channel 260 to Alva, Oklahoma, in lieu of channel 259, and the concomitant allotments of Channel 259 to Sedan, Kansas, and Tuttle, Oklahoma, will result in a preferential arrangement of allotments pursuant to the Commission’s established procedures respecting the change of communities.^{3/} In line with those procedures, the existing arrangement of allotments must be compared with the proposal utilizing the following FM allotment priorities: (i) first full-time aural service; (ii) second full-time aural service; (iii) first local service; and (iv) other public interest matters.

In the case at hand, the first two allotment priorities are not pertinent because no white or gray areas will be created or eliminated. Conversely, the third allotment priority is indeed pertinent, because the allotments of Channel 259 to both Sedan, Kansas, and Tuttle, Oklahoma, will afford those communities their first local aural transmission services. The fact that Sedan and Tuttle would receive their first local aural channels, actually serves the highest of the Commission's existing allocation priorities, to wit: "There are virtually no populated areas of the country where our higher allotment priorities, such as first reception service, have not been attained. Therefore, as a practical matter, provision of first local aural service is the highest of our allotment priorities which remains in any significant degree unsatisfied."^{4/}

The Commission previously has determined that Tuttle, Oklahoma, is worthy of having Channel 259 allocated to it as its first local aural service. *See FM Table of Allotments (Alva, Moreland, Tishomingo, Tuttle, and Woodward, Oklahoma)*, 17 FCC Rcd 14722; *recon.* (reversed on procedural grounds) Memorandum Opinion and Order, FCC 05-64, (hereafter referred to as "*Tuttle MO&O*") released March 14, 2005. Except for the absence of a continuing expression of interest on the part of the original petitioner, which resulted from issues unrelated to the allotment priorities pertaining to Tuttle, it reasonably must be presumed that Tuttle, Oklahoma, remains worthy of the allocation of its first local aural service.

Further, because Channel 260 is proposed for reallocation to Alva, Oklahoma, and the license for KNID accordingly modified, Alva will not lose any service at all. Moreover, KNID's facilities will be protected because the allotment of Channel 260C1 at Alva is mutually exclusive with the current allotment of Channel 259C1 there.

The attached Technical Statement indicates that there is pending a petition for rule making that proposes the allotment of FM Channel 259A to Lexington, Oklahoma, CDBS Application ID No. 1006922, filed by Charles Crawford. That allotment is shortspaced both with the Channel 259 allotment at Tuttle, Oklahoma, which was vacated by the Tuttle MO&O, and the Channel 259 allotment at Tishomingo, Oklahoma which results from the Tuttle MO&O. Accordingly, in accordance with the language of the Tuttle MO&O, the Lexington, Oklahoma, rule making petition must be dismissed, and is not relevant to the instant proposal. *See* Tuttle MO&O, ¶ 6.^{5/}

Inasmuch as the instant proposal will fulfill the third allotment priority, while the *status quo* would only trigger the fourth priority, a grant of the instant proposal will

That Petition, however, was filed more than two years after the Order reallocating the Channels at Woodward and, thus, is out of time, and can not be within the scope of the matters addressed via the Tuttle MO&O.

result in a preferential arrangement of allotments. Thus, this proposal serves the public interest.

C. Sedan, Kansas, the Community. Sedan, Kansas is an incorporated city, with a population (according to the 2000 U.S. Census) of 1,342 persons. It is the County Seat for Chautauqua County, Kansas. *See Exhibit B.*

Sedan's government consists of an elected Mayor and city council. Sedan has its own independent fire department and has its own police chief and local police force. *See Exhibit B.*

There are approximately 341 students in Sedan Elementary School and 143 students in Sedan High School. There are a total of 46 teachers and 3 administrators between both schools. Sedan residents can enjoy the Public Library, that is a member of the Southeast Kansas Regional Library System. Story Time every Wednesday and a summer Reading Program to foster the education of its residents are just some of the services offered by the library. *See Exhibit B.*

Recreation in Sedan, Kansas comes in various ways. The Gregg Theater shows first run movies on weekends and is home to a local talented community theater group, which produces two to three performances during the year. For the sport's lover, Municipal Golf Course provides a nine hole, hilly terrain course for their delight. There is also organized baseball and softball associations; Sedan being the home to the champion traveling men's fast pitch softball team. For more recreation, local residents at-

tend Sedan City Park, which includes an Olympic-sized swimming pool. The park also offers a playground, tennis courts, and a camping facility. Sedan also offers a the Emmett Kelly Museum in downtown Sedan, which honors a native son, the famous Emmett Kelly (1898-1979), located in the 1896 Opera House on Main Street. The collection includes memorabilia of his circus career as well as many items related to its local history. *See Exhibit B.*

Amongst the Sedan Area Chamber of Commerce, Sedan offers a variety of businesses and services to its residents. There are three local banks in Sedan: Bank of Sedan (125 W. Main Street, Sedan); Commercial Federal Bank 215 E. Main Street, Sedan (215 E. Main Street, Sedan); and First National Bank of Sedan (intersection of Main and Chautauqua Streets, Sedan). Healthcare in Sedan can be provided by the city hospital known as Sedan City Hospital (300 North Street, Sedan). There are also three clinics in Sedan: Tallgrass Rural Health Clinic (also 300 North Street, Sedan); Sedan Chiropractic (311 E. Elm Street, Sedan); and Sells Chiropractic (127 North Chautauqua Street, Sedan). Chautauqua Hills Dental Center (120 West Osage Street, Sedan) and Dana's Rx Shoppe (115 E. Main Street, Sedan) also provide services to the community of Sedan, Kansas. *See Exhibit B.*

Sedan offers it citizens a variety of special events from an Annual Redbud Tour, hosted by Sedan Area Chamber of Commerce, consisting of a mapped route taking visitors through the county to see the spectacular native redbuds in full bloom, to the NATRC Trail Riding Competition, hosted by Three Barns, comprised of 60 horses in

competition from Kansas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Missouri. Sedan also offers the Annual Yellow Brick Road Festival, the Blues Festival, the Annual Chautauqua Hills Chuck Wagon Races, the Chautauqua County Fair and Rodeo, the “Be a Clown” Day, the Designer Quilt Show and finally, the Chautauqua County Fall Festival and Ranch Rodeo. *See Exhibit B.* The *Sedan Times* is the local newspaper service Sedan, Kansas.

In short, Sedan, Kansas, possesses the requisite social, economic and cultural components that are commonly associated with community status. *FM Table of Allotments (East Hemet, CA)* 67 RR 2d 146, 147 (1989) (hereafter “*E. Hemet, CA*”).

D. Tuttle, Oklahoma, the Community. Tuttle is an incorporated city, located in Grady County, with a population of 4,294 people, according to 2000 U.S. Census data, and occupying 29.2 square miles of land. Tuttle has an elected mayor, city manager, and a city council form of government. Tuttle has its own independent fire department (4 SE 2nd Street, Tuttle) and it also has its own police department (4 SE 2nd Street, Tuttle), and municipal court. Tuttle is not located in an Urbanized Area.

Tuttle maintains a school system that provides education for children from kindergarten through the 12th grade. Children in Tuttle attend a local elementary school consisting of 364 students (106 SW 2nd Street, Tuttle; Grades K–6), a local middle school consisting of 294 students (402 East Oaks Street, Tuttle; Grades 6–8), and a local high school consisting of 414 students (604 S. Cimarron Road, Tuttle, Grades 9–12). Along with the schools, Tuttle also has a center, known as Tuttle Learning Center

(4 Briscoe Drive, Tuttle) for after school tutoring, as well as childcare. There are few businesses and services offered to Tuttle residents. Tuttle has a City of Ambulance Service that transfers Tuttle residents to nearest hospitals. Tuttle has two banks, including Sooner State Bank and First National Bank and Trust Company, and an insurance agency – Tuttle Insurance Agency, to offer to its residents.

Tuttle, Oklahoma, its own post office and ZIP Code – 73089. The U.S. Census Bureau indicates that there are nearly 150 business located within that ZIP Code, including one utility, 36 construction-related businesses, 22 retail businesses, including the Star Pharmacy (302 W. Main Street, Tuttle); nine finance and insurance-related businesses; and 20 service-related businesses. *See Exhibit C* for the U.S. Census Bureau's 2002 Industry Code Summary for Tuttle, Oklahoma.

There are numerous houses of worship in Tuttle, Oklahoma, including a Catholic Church and approximately twenty churches representing various Protestant denominations. *See Exhibit C.*

The *Tuttle Times* is the community's local newspaper, which was established in 1905, and is published each Wednesday from offices located at 8 Southwest Third Street, Tuttle.

In short, consistent with the Commission's prior findings in MM Docket 98-155, 17 FCC Rcd 14722, Tuttle, Oklahoma, possesses the requisite social, economic

and cultural components that are commonly associated with community status. *See E. Hemet, CA, supra.*

As noted, Tuttle, Oklahoma, is not located within an urbanized area. The Oklahoma City Urbanized Area is the closest to Tuttle. From the reference site for a Tuttle station, only 26% of the Oklahoma City Urbanized Area would receive a 70 dBu or greater signal. *See Exhibit A.* Accordingly, considering that less than fifty percent (50%) of the Oklahoma City Urbanized Area would be served by the predicted 70 dBu contour from the proposed Tuttle, Oklahoma, station, the tenets established in *RKO General*, 5 FCC Rcd 3222 (1990) and *Faye and Richard Tuck*, 3 FCC Rcd 5374 (1988) are satisfied and there is no need to assess whether the allotment involves a migration of the allotment into an urban area.

E. *OKAN's Expression of Interest.* Should the Commission amend the FM Table of Allotments, as requested and allot Channel 259C3 to Sedan, Kansas, as well as to Tuttle, Oklahoma, at such time and in accordance with such procedures as directed by the Commission, OKAN promptly will file the requisite applications to contend for and obtain authority to construct the new station at both Sedan, Kansas, and Tuttle, Oklahoma; and, if authorized and granted, will timely construct and seek to license the Channel 259 facilities for those communities.

II. CONCLUSION

For the reasons stated above, the public interest will be served by the allotment of Channel 259 to Sedan, Kansas and to Tuttle, Oklahoma, to provide the first local aural services for these communities, as well as by the reallocation of FM Channel 260 in lieu of 259 at Alva, Oklahoma.^{6/}

Accordingly, OKAN respectfully requests the Commission promptly institute a rule making proceeding that will amend the FM Table of Allotments as follows:

It also is respectfully requested that the Commission is an order directing the licensee of radio broadcast station KNID(FM), Alva, Oklahoma (FCC Facility ID No. 37123) to show cause why the license for the station should not be modified to operate on Channel 260C1 at Alva, Oklahoma.^{7/}



TECHNICAL STATEMENT

Petition for Rule Making

This Technical Exhibit supports the Petition for Rule Making proposing the assignment of Channel 259C3 to Sedan, Kansas and Channel 259C3 to Tuttle, Oklahoma. This proposal will provide the first local service to the city of Sedan, Kansas. Sedan is the county seat of Chautauqua County. According to the 2000 U.S. Census the city of Sedan, Kansas has a population of 1,342 persons. Additional information on Sedan can be found elsewhere in this proposal. Sedan meets the Commission's requirements as a community, therefore it is eligible for an FM assignment.

For the city of Sedan, it is proposed to utilize an allocation site of North Latitude 37° 08' 04" and West Longitude 96° 09' 36". From this allocation site, the entire city of Sedan will receive a 70 dBu city grade signal (see Exhibit #1A). The 60 dBu contour will provide service to 15,187 persons (2000 U.S. Census) and covers an area of 4,657 square kilometers.

As stated before, it is also proposed to allocate Channel 259C3 to Tuttle, Oklahoma. This proposal will provide first local service to the city of Tuttle. Tuttle is located in Grady County, Oklahoma. According to the 2000 U.S. Census, the city of Tuttle has a population of 4,294 persons. Additional information on Tuttle can be found

elsewhere in this proposal. Tuttle meets the Commission's requirements as a community, therefore it is eligible for an FM assignment.

For the city of Tuttle, it is proposed to utilize an allocation site of North Latitude 35° 17' 33" and West Longitude 97° 42' 58". From this allocation site, the entire city of Tuttle will receive a 70 dBu city grade signal (see Exhibit #2A). The 60 dBu contour will provide service to 826,292 persons (2000 U.S. Census) and covers an area of 4,657 square kilometers. Even though the city of Tuttle is near Oklahoma City, we show in Exhibit #2C that it is not within the Oklahoma City Urbanized Area and from the proposed site, 26% of the Urbanized Area will receive a 70 dBu or greater signal.


In order to meet all of the spacing requirements of §73.207 for the proposed assignments to Sedan and Tuttle, one channel change must be made. We propose to change the allocation at Alva, Oklahoma from Channel 259C1 to Channel 260C1 and assign KNID (FM) to that channel. Channel 260C1 can be used by KNID (FM) from the licensed site and meet all of the spacing requirements of §73.207 of the Commission's rules. See Exhibit #1B for the Sedan, Kansas Allocation Study and Exhibit #2B for the Tuttle, Oklahoma Allocation Study. From the licensed site, KNID will still provide city grade service to 100% of Alva, Oklahoma, its community of license (see Exhibit #3A). Exhibit #2B is an allocation study showing the spacings from the KNID licensed site after KNID is assigned to Channel 260C1 and Channel 259C3 is allocated to the cities of Sedan, Kansas and Tuttle, Oklahoma.

Exhibit #4 is an allocation study showing the spacings from the Tishomingo, Oklahoma vacant allocation site on Channel 259C3.




Exhibit #1A



Sedan is the county seat of Chautauqua [CQ] county and is located on business US 166 and K-99. The beautiful wooded hills of the surrounding country, and the active downtown filled with Victorian stores make this one of the prettiest towns in Kansas.

Farming, ranching, and petroleum are all important parts of the local economy, but in recent years tourism has become more and more significant. Over 50,000 visitors come each year to enjoy the scenery and attractions of the area that many call the "Kansas Ozarks". The recent designation of highway 166 as a scenic route will probably bring even more.

- Ackarman Hardware in Sedan has been open since 1879; it's an American classic!

The city of Sedan was established in 1876. Legend says Sedan was named for Sedan, France, due to the similarity in the wooded rolling hills. In the 1880's a building boom resulted in the construction of many brick, sandstone, and limestone buildings downtown.






Emmett Kelly Museum







Description

Chautauqua County is mostly covered with rocky, oak-covered hills. Big valleys, particularly the valley of the Caney River, have rich and fertile farms and some of the hills are clear and home to thousands of grazing cattle. The spectacular beauty and ruggedness of the countryside make it a great place for outdoor vacations. Steve Harper's book of Kansas day trips has a nice tour of the County.

History



Organized in 1875. County seat Sedan. Created out of a portion of what was first Godfrey county, named after "Bill" Godfrey, a noted trader among the Osages; then Howard county in honor of Major-General O. O. Howard, for his efforts in behalf of the Union. Chautauqua county N.Y., was the former home of Hon. Edward Jaquins, a member of the Kansas Legislature in 1875 from Howard county, who introduced the bill which divided Howard into Chautauqua and Elk; hence, from his native place this county derives its name. The name originally given (in 1855) to Howard was Godfrey, and the name changed to Seward in 1861. In 1867 the Legislature, ignoring former names, created the county of Howard.

Chautauqua County was founded in 1875 when Howard County was split in two after bitter county seat wars. Early settlers benefited from the cattle trade from Oklahoma and Texas. In 1904, oil was discovered and the area had a big "boomtown" era.

William G. Cutler's *History of Kansas*, first published in 1883, tells about early Chautauqua County.

There is a section on Chautauqua County in the book *Kansas: a Cyclopedia Of State History* by Frank Blackmar (1912).

Notice is also given that the Tuttle City Council will hold a public hearing on the same issue and to hear the recommendations of the Tuttle Planning Commission on Monday, the 13th day of June, 2005, at 6:00 p.m. at the Tuttle City Hall, 301 West Main, Tuttle, Oklahoma.

All interested parties may attend either or both of these public hearings.

Section 49 of the Planning Digest Reads:

A. Passage by the City Council

(1) Every such proposed amendment shall be referred by the City Planning Commission for report. If a protest against such amendment be presented, duly signed and acknowledged by the owners of twenty percent (20%) or more of the land within such area proposed to be altered, or by the owner of twenty percent (20%) or more of the area of the lots immediately abutting either side of the territory included in such proposed change, or separated therefrom only by an alley or street, such amendment shall not be passed except by the favorable vote of three-fourths (3/4) of the City Council.

(2) Whenever the owners of fifty-one per cent (51%) of the land in any area shall present an amendment of the regulations prescribed for such area, it shall be the duty of the City Council to vote upon such amendment within ninety (90) days of the filing of same by the petitioners with the City Clerk.




