**Re: Applications for Authority to Transfer Control to Sprint Corporation Licenses and Authorizations Held by Nextel Communications, Inc., WT Docket No. 05-63.**

Dear Mr. Jones:

On February 16, 2005, the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau ("Bureau") issued a Protective Order (DA 05-423) regarding confidential or proprietary documents submitted by Sprint Corp. ("Sprint") and Nextel Communications, Inc. ("Nextel"), and others that have become parties to this proceeding. On April 29, 2005, the Bureau issued initial information requests to Sprint and Nextel. On May 20, 2005, the Bureau released a Second Protective Order (DA 05-1480) granting additional protection to documents Sprint and Nextel expected to produce that would constitute particularly sensitive business information.

On May 26, 2005, you requested that we modify the Second Protective Order to include those documents that respond to Sprint Information Request 6 and that "provide in detail a Submitting Party's current or future plans to compete for specific groups or types of customers, or detail a Submitting Party's current or future procurement strategies, product strategies, or advertising or marketing strategies." Upon further consideration, by this letter we are modifying the Second Protective Order consistent with that request.
