On June 13, 2005, Vonya B. Krevor, Vice President, Government Affairs, Nextel Communications, Inc. (“Nextel”); and A. Richard Metzger, Jr. and the undersigned, Lawler, Metzger, Milkman & Keeney, LLC, outside counsel to Nextel, met with Samuel Feder of Chairman Martin’s office; Scott Delacourt, Paul D’Ari, Synghee Hahn, Dennis Johnson, Heidi Kroll, Sara Mechanic, Paul E. Murray, Lauren K. Patrich, Louis Peraertz, John J. Schauble, Ziad Sleem, Walter D. Strack, and D’wana R. Terry of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau; William Dever of the Wireline Competition Bureau; as well as James R. Bird, Michele P. Ellison, and Kent R. Nilsson of the Office of General Counsel.

During that meeting, representatives of Sprint and Nextel discussed the above-referenced pending application. In the course of the discussion, Commission staff raised several clarifying questions concerning the information filed by Sprint and Nextel in response to the FCC’s Initial Information and Document Requests of April 29, 2005, specifically, request nos. Nextel 6, Nextel 12/Sprint 13, and Nextel 21.¹ Sprint and

Nextel agreed, where appropriate, to supplement as promptly as possible their responses to address staff's questions. Sprint and Nextel also reiterated their request for expedited approval of the proposed transaction.
