2004 Red White and Blue Parade

The city's annual parade will start at 9 a.m. on June 26

Floats, horses, clowns, and dance groups will be in the Red, White, and Blue Parade in Citrus Heights on Saturday, June 26th. The City's annual parade will start at 9 a.m. and go down Sunrise Boulevard, between Uplands Way and Greenback Lane, and end at Sunrise Mall's parking lot.

James Shelby, Mayor of Citrus Heights, will be the grand marshal and the Sacramento Sheriff's Posse will be the lead-off color guard. The theme of this year's parade is "And the Beautiful" that will be sung by Citrus Heights prominent singer, Linda Adams, on the Nursery's float.

This year's parade features more than 125 entries and approximately 1,500 participants. One of the more unique entries will be 100 decorated red wagons that celebrate the Wagon Ministry reaching an organization goal of donating 1,000 wagons to underprivileged children. Other entries will be sponsored by businesses, youth organizations, and neighborhood associations. Many cars will include yellow ribbons in honor of American troops.

Several music groups will be in the parade including an accordion band, a children's band, a saxophone band, and a drum and bugle corp.

Cruising Carrie from Radio Disney will emcee the review stand.

Honored guests in the parade will be two Champions of Citrus Heights who were crowned with baseball caps at the Breakfast of Champions this week. Andy Borovansky and Mark Purvis were chosen because of their service to the community.



Citrus Heights Community Marching Band Will Make Its Debut in the Red, White, & Blue Parade

With more than 25 musicians, the Citrus Heights Community Marching Band has begun practicing for its debut in the Citrus Heights' Red, White, and Blue Parade on Saturday, June 25th.

"All music sections are represented," said Linda Glover, a member of the Parade Committee and co-organizer of the band. "We have woodwinds, brass, percussion, and two Sousaphone players but we can always use more musicians. We are playing basic marching music at the entry level and are having so much fun."

Directors of the band are Mark Tolga, music director at Sylvan Middle School, and Tiff Kinser, director of music at Mesa Verde High School.

Musicians range in age from 11 to 63. They include two former music professors; elementary, middle, and high school students; professional people; and others who have been in marching bands and "wanted to do it again."

Kathy Cook, a Parade Committee member and the other band co-organizer, encourages people to call if they are interested in becoming part of the band. "We are just beginning practice marching," she said. Requirements include being able to play an instrument and march.

"We created the band because we always had trouble finding a marching band for our parade," said Glover and Cook.

Founded by Capt. William Henry Winter in 1871 as Fall City, becoming Fall River Mills in 1888-89. Although not the first settlement to be established in the Fall River Valley, the town grew in the 1870's and '80's to become the principle industrial and agricultural center of eastern Shasta County. By 1886 Fall City consisted of two hotels, a blacksmith and wagon shop, two livery stables, three stores, two saloons, a harness shop, a boot and shoe shop, a millinery, Winter's flour mill, Florins Bros.' wooden-ware and sash and door factory, and was home to 300 souls.

mile long lake from the park for fishing, boating and water skiing. Hat Creek, south of the highway junction, is also know for its wild trout. Farther south, Highway 89 leads to Lassen Volcanic National Park.

Fall River Mills & Hat Creek [TOP](#)

Traveling east from the crossroads on Highway 299 leads to the town of Fall River Mills, the Fall River Valley and the gem-like Big Lake, Fall River Lake, Eastman Lake, Crystal Lake and Baum Lake. Trout-filled streams, mountain air and stunning vistas complement the high valley, which also produces 25 percent of the world's wild rice. Nearby Ahjumawi Lava Springs State Park is considered the most isolated park in the state. Access to the park is by boat only, but a land purchase by the state may make it accessible by non-boaters in the future.

Huge freshwater springs well up from underground lava tubes and feed the Fall River and several other creeks and lakes. The fishing is mythic and bald eagles, golden eagles, red-tailed hawks and other raptors are common.

The Fort Crook Museum in Fall River Mills contains exhibits and artifacts depicting the life of early settlers and Native Americans, including an authentic dugout canoe. Included are six complete rooms of antique furniture, a blacksmith shop, an 1860s schoolhouse and even the Fall River Mills original jail.

The Fall River Valley Golf Course is an extremely popular, superb 18-hole championship course. Reservations are often necessary two weeks in advance. Call for tee times.

The Glenburn Church, located eight miles from Fall River Mills on McArthur Road was built in 1886 and is still heated with a pot-bellied stove.

For winter adventure and fun in the snow, the Ashpan Snowmobile Park offers over 50 miles of groomed trails that follow forest roads. The park is used by cross-country skiers also. Contact the Hat Creek Ranger District at (530) 336-5521 for accessibility



REASON FOR INQUIRY:

California Penal Code Section 933.5 empowers the Grand Jury to investigate and report on the operations of any special purpose assessing or taxing district in the county. During the year, the Grand Jury received two citizens' complaints regarding the Fall River Mills Community Services District.

BACKGROUND:

The Fall River Mills Community Services District (District) was created in 1904. It services the area from the Fall River Golf Course to Mayers Memorial Hospital along California Highway 299 East. The District has 469 customers and provides water and sewer services to residences and businesses. The District employs one full time District Manager, one full time Utility Worker, and one part time Account Clerk. A board of five directors governs the District; one of them serves as President of the Board.

In 1973, the District issued Revenue Bonds in the original amount of \$450,000 for water system construction. In 1979, Revenue Bonds in the original amount of \$275,000 were issued for a sewer system. In 1977, the District obtained a Drought Relief Loan in the original amount of \$77,000 from the Farmers Home Administration for water system construction.

The District has three large storage tanks and two wells: the Knoch well and the McArthur well.

Nestled in the mountains between Mounts Shasta and Lassen lies the beautiful Fall River Valley. Almost entirely spring fed, the Fall River winds for sixteen miles, usually through private agricultural land. It used to empty directly into the Pit River close to the town of Fall River Mills, but is now taken through Saddle Mountain via penstocks to the Pit 1 Power House.

The weather can be cold in winter, but is quite pleasant through the spring, summer and early fall, with warm days and cool nights and an occasional evening thunder shower. Fishing is plentiful in several lakes and rivers in the area, and hunting is good for both deer and waterfowl through their seasons.

The soil is rich and water plentiful, providing for a thriving agricultural community. We are known for our "Fall River Wild Rice", a grower-owned cooperative, as well as for the cattle, hay, lavender, and mint produced here. We have very comfy lodges and motels, a good choice of restaurants, equestrian and rodeo events, a Clark Glasson designed and built golf course, the Fort Crook Museum, white water rafting, artists, galleries, and world class fly fishing. There are also good biking and hiking trails.

In the area are also several State Parks, including one only accessible by water.




Mayers Memorial Hospital



Fort Crook was established on July 1, 1857, to protect travelers on the Shasta - Yreka Road and the Lockhart Ferries. Built by Company A, 1st Dragoons under the command of Captain John W. T. Gardner, the fort consisted of 25 - 30 log buildings enclosed by a pine-pole stockade 12 feet high.

It was located on the Fall River about 7 miles north of the current museum grounds. Originally called Camp Hollenbush, the outpost was soon renamed in honor of Lt. George Crook, then in command of Company D, 4th Infantry. Crook became a General during the Civil War and gained national fame as both a fighter of and advocate for the Plains Indians

The **Fort Crook Historical Society** was founded in 1934. We are dedicated to collecting, preserving and presenting the history of the Intermountain area.

The **Fort Crook Museum** was built in 1962 - 65 entirely by generous donations of time and materials members of the communities it serves and by members of the Fort Crook Historical Society.

Today it is a very active community enterprise. Many of our current members are family members of the first settlers, some simply appreciate the heritage generated by those settlers. We have some large projects (including


