Dear Ms. Dortch:

Today, Dick Juhnke and I in person, and Bill Cheek, Jeff Caswell, Al Lubeck and Jocelyn Fallon by telephone, met with Christi Shewman, Tim Stelzig, Nick Alexander, Carol Simpson and Ian Dillner, all of the Wireline Competition Bureau, to discuss Sprint Local's provision of E911 services to VoIP service providers. Sprint expressed its commitment to work directly with VoIP service providers to meet the 120-day implementation deadline specified in the Commission's June 3, 2005 *E911 VoIP Order*, and briefly described the E911 service inquiries received to date. Sprint stated that it has 28 selective routers serving approximately 500-600 PSAPs. Sprint also stated that the solution it is developing for VoIP service providers is essentially the same as that provided to CMRS carriers, based on NENA I2. Sprint explained its general policy of requiring customers to provide their own pseudo-ANIs, and advised that capacity considerations in our selective routers do not currently affect our ability to fulfill service requests received thus far.

I request that this letter, which is being filed electronically, be placed in the file for the above-captioned proceedings.
