Dear Mr. Margie:

This is to follow up on our recent conversation concerning the above-referenced matter. In our discussion, it was noted that US Unwired Inc. would be seeking to enjoin the Sprint-Nextel merger because upon closing, Sprint will be in breach of certain exclusivity provisions contained in Sprint's contract with US Unwired pursuant to which US Unwired today provides services in the south-central United States under the Sprint brand name. Sprint's breach will cause irreparable harm to US Unwired and since negotiations to date have failed, we stated that US Unwired would be seeking injunctive relief imminently.

For your reference, enclosed is a copy of US Unwired's Complaint for Injunctive Relief and associated briefing papers, filed June 21, 2005 in U.S. District Court for the Western District of Louisiana. The papers outline in detail US Unwired's claim, along the lines of our discussion. To reiterate, Sprint's breach is clear, it will cause irreparable harm, and the contract sets forth injunctive relief as the remedy.

We urge the Commission to thoroughly review whether the public interest benefits set forth in the referenced applications can be realized if an injunction issues and Sprint is barred from operating the Nextel assets in a substantial portion of the geographic territory affected by the proposed transaction.
