

I support Indiana's "Do Not Call" law, and do not want to see it diluted by Federal action. I used to receive 1 or 2 calls almost every suppertime at home, and several throughout each day, but since Indiana made most telephone solicitations illegal, such calls have slowed to only one or two per month.

If unsolicited telephone calling is once again allowed, I believe it improperly uses telephone switching and facilities that force higher rates by making the telephone companies overbuild facilities to handle the extra switching.
