On June 29, 2005, the undersigned, accompanied by Jared Abbruzzese, Chairman of the Board of TerreStar Networks Inc. ("TerreStar"), Wharton B. "Zie" Rivers, Jr., President and CEO of TerreStar, and Alfred E. Mottur, a consultant to TerreStar, met with Commissioner Michael J. Copps and his legal advisor, Paul Margie, to discuss the above-referenced proceedings.

During the meeting, TerreStar addressed matters already reflected in its prior filings made in the above-caption matters, chiefly that the public interest would be served by the expeditious distribution of surrendered 2 GHz frequencies to TMI/TerreStar and ICO, so that each operator would have access to a total of 20 MHz of spectrum.
