Dear Ms. Dortch:

On behalf of Nextel Communications, Inc. (“Nextel”), and pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Federal Communications Commission’s (“Commission’s”) Rules, this letter constitutes notice that Lawrence Krevor and Jared Carlson, of Nextel met yesterday with Barry Ohlson, Senior Legal Advisor to Commissioner Jonathan Adelstein.

Mr. Krevor and Mr. Carlson discussed the extraordinary efforts Nextel has made to address the Global Positioning System (“A-GPS”) software issue that affected several models of Motorola iDEN handsets last year. These efforts included, among other things, repeated communications with affected subscribers as well as the unprecedented step of express mailing to all affected customers a kit consisting of a cable, a CD-ROM, and instructions enabling them to correct the software glitch on their own without having to visit a Nextel retail store or service center.

Nextel’s representatives also described how the Sprint Nextel merger is expected to result in quicker development of new technologies and services, thus making new handsets more attractive and potentially accelerating replacement of older, non-GPS capable handsets. In addition, the marketing of services between the two companies may generate greater crossover of existing customers, resulting in higher sales of GPS-enabled handsets on both networks. Finally, the sales momentum of both entities is expected to increase with increased scale, resulting in more new customers purchasing GPS-enabled devices.

During the meeting, we provided Mr. Ohlson a copy of Nextel’s *ex parte* letter to the Commission dated Monday, July 11, 2005, detailing the meeting of July 8, 2005, between representatives of Nextel and Paul Margie, Commissioner Michael J. Copps’s Legal Advisor. *See* Letter from Laura L. Holloway, Vice President, Nextel Communications, Inc., to Marlene H. Dortch, Secretary, Federal Communications Commission, CC Docket 94-102 (July 11, 2005).
