

I am submitting comments on ET Docket No. 05-247, regarding Continental Airlines use of a free wireless service in Logan Airport.

I have used Massposts expensive internet access service at Logan Airport in the past. I believe that the true intention of Massport in this case is to create an artificial scarcity of internet access, in order to own a monopoly on the business of providing wireless access to customers.

Continental's free wireless access is clearly attractive to business travellers, such as myself, who need to get online while travelling.

Any claims that the use of Continental's wireless node presents an "unacceptable potential risk" to communications gear used by the state police and the Transportation Security Administration should be viewed with extreme skepticism. Using a laptop computer, an ethernet cable and a commercially available wireless router such as Apple's Airport Express, I can create a wireless network at Logan Airport at any time. If TSA's communications are vulnerable to a wireless network, they need to improve their communication systems immediately. I can't believe they haven't done so already.
