**ARMSTRONG DIGITAL SERVICES, INC.  
MOTION TO ACCEPT LATE-FILED  
SUBSCRIBER NOTIFICATION REPORT**

Armstrong Digital Services, Inc. (“Armstrong Telephone”) files this Motion to accept its late-filed Subscriber Notification Report under 47 CFR § 1.205.

1. On July 26, 2005, the Enforcement Bureau issued a Public Notice in these dockets that provided that an interconnected VoIP service provider could receive a 30-day extension of time in which to obtain customer acknowledgements regarding the limitations on the provider’s E911 service by filing a subscriber notification report with the Bureau by August 10, 2005.
2. Armstrong Telephone was diligent in preparing the report, but was unable to complete the information in the report until August 11, 2005 due to staffing limitations. Armstrong Telephone filed the report today. The filing confirmation is attached as Exhibit 1.
3. 47 CFR § 1.205 provides:

Continuances of any proceeding or hearing and extensions of time for making any filing or performing any act required or allowed to be done within a specified time may be granted by the Commission or the presiding

officer upon motion for good cause shown, unless the time for performance or filing is limited by statute.

4. Good cause exists in this case. Accepting Armstrong Telephone's report is in the public interest, as the report will provide the Bureau with a more complete and accurate record of the status of compliance with the Commission's E911 rules for interconnected VoIP providers. *See, e.g., In the Matter of Rules and Regulations Implementing the Telephone Consumer Protection Act of 1991, Report and Order*, 18 FCC Rcd. 14,014 (2003) at ¶ 220. *See also, In the Matter of Bell Atlantic Progress Report on Compliance with Bell Atlantic/NYNEX Merger Order Conditions, Order*, 14 FCC Rcd. 4403 (1999) at ¶ 6.
5. Further, the August 10, 2005 deadline is not required by any statute, accordingly, the Commission has the authority to grant the requested extension.
6. Finally, accepting Armstrong Telephone's report will not prejudice any person, especially considering that the report is only one day late and that Armstrong Telephone has already received affirmative acknowledgements from 96% of its voice customers.
7. In order to provide a full and complete record in this docket, and because no person will be prejudiced by acceptance of Armstrong Telephone's report, Armstrong Telephone requests that the Enforcement Bureau accept its late-filed report in this docket.
