

I am writing to support the application by Continental Airlines for permission to maintain their WiFi antenna at Logan International Airport. MassPort contends that the wireless access the airline provides to its passengers is a security risk but this is not substantiated by fact or history and Wi-Fi service has been available without problems and with great convenience for frequent travellers by airlines for several years. What is really behind this is MassPort's commercial relationship to another private vendor. If there were a security risk, why would MassPort have another vendor offering a similar service or not be protesting the T-Mobile Wi-Fi hotspots in Delta's airline clubs. The FCC should protect the public's access to this important service which Continental offers free to users of its airline clubs and allow the airline to keep its antenna at Logan. Thank you.
