Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Friday, August 19, 2005, on behalf of SBC, I spoke by telephone with Mark Uretsky of the International Bureau and answered his questions regarding the international traffic carried by subsidiaries of SBC. Specifically, I informed Mr. Uretsky that SBC Long Distance, LLC (“SBC-LD”) resold [REDACTED] minutes in 2004 and [REDACTED] minutes in 2003 to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] combined. Given that SBC-LD reported 1,740,778,163.14 minutes of international traffic in 2004 and 835,265,894 minutes in 2003, by subtraction, it sold [REDACTED] minutes in 2004 and [REDACTED] minutes in 2003 to its retail end users, including a de minimis amount for affiliates’ official services communications. I further informed Mr. Uretsky that SNET America does not sell international service to other carriers but only to end users.

Today, pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Commission’s Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206, and the Order Adopting Protective Order,<sup>1</sup> SBC is filing the confidential version of this letter with Gary Remondino of the Wireline Competition Bureau and with your office and the redacted version in ECFS. The unredacted letter will be made
