Dear Ms. Dortch:

Journal Broadcast Corporation (“JBC”), licensee of analog television station WTMJ-TV, Channel 4, and digital television station WTMJ-DT, Channel 28, both Milwaukee, Wisconsin, by its attorneys, hereby supplements its June 29, 2005 request for limited relief (the “Extension Request”) from the July 1, 2005 digital construction deadline and replication requirement established in *Report and Order*, “Second Periodic Review of the Commission’s Rules and Policies Affecting the Conversion to Digital Television,” FCC 04-192 (Sept. 7, 2004) (“*Second Periodic Review Order*”).

WTMJ-DT is authorized to operate, and for several years has been operating, at its full replication facilities at 1,000 kW ERP pursuant to a license granted on January 24, 2001. See FCC File No. BLCDDT-20001218ACR. In the Extension Request, JBC advised the Commission that, shortly before the July 1 deadline, heat damage to WTMJ-DT’s antenna system had forced JBC to reduce the station’s ERP to 250 kW and to request special temporary authority (“STA”) for reduced-power operation.

By this letter, JBC notifies the Commission that WTMJ-DT resumed operation at its licensed replication facilities on August 17, 2005, and that the Extension Request is no longer necessary. (A request for withdrawal of the STA was filed on August 22, 2005 (copy attached)). Accordingly, for all the reasons

stated herein and in the Extension Request, JBC respectfully requests that WTMJ-DT be deemed to be in compliance with the applicable digital construction deadline and replication requirement effective as of July 1, 2005, and that it be afforded interference protection to its authorized service area to the full extent permitted under the *Second Periodic Review Order*.
