Dear Ms. Dortch:

On behalf of Sprint Nextel Corporation (Sprint), Larry Krevor and I met Friday, September 30, 2005 with John Branscome of Commissioner Kathleen Abernathy's office. We discussed the attached presentation relevant to Dockets 03-66 and 02-364.

We also addressed the pending reconsideration of the Commission's decision in Docket 02-55. As Sprint has explained, the relief that AIRPEAK Communications, LLC and other parties have demanded has nothing to do with the three primary goals underlying the Commission's plan for reconfiguring the 800 MHz band. The Commission's public interest goals were: (1) the resolution of interference to public safety systems by separating low-site, high-density cellular systems from high-site systems; (2) the provision of additional spectrum for public safety communications; and (3) the provision of comparable facilities to retuned licensees. Rather than advancing these public interest goals, the petitioners simply seek unwarranted enhancements to their own spectrum positions. Granting these self-serving proposals would undermine the Commission's effort to ensure that Sprint receives sufficient replacement spectrum as part of the value-for-value equation that underlies the 800 MHz band reconfiguration decision.
