



The Mohave County Sheriff is an elected official serving a four-year term and by state law, is responsible for preserving the peace, preventing public disorder and maintaining public safety. His is required to maintain the Mohave County Jail and care for all prisoners placed in his custody; to enforce and serve all civil processes issued within the county; and to coordinate all search and rescue operations in the county plus the training and monitoring of approximately 200 volunteers who participate in this function.

Divisions of the Mohave County Sheriff's Office include:

PATROL DIVISION - consists of uniformed officers stationed in Butler (near Kingman), Golden Valley, Mohave Valley and Desert Hills. Additionally, resident deputies are in Dolan Springs, Meadview and the Arizona Strip.

Officers assigned to this division work to ensure the safety of the public by responding to disturbances, crimes in progress, traffic accidents and people needing assistance. Officers provide patrol to deter crime and answer citizens' call for service. Officers are responsible for investigation of crimes, both misdemeanors and felonies, and conduct initial investigations on cases referred to the Detective Division. Officers assigned to the Patrol Division also enforce traffic laws, principally on county roadways.

Officers are also assigned to patrol the Colorado River, Lake Havasu and Lake Mead. These units provide waterway safety enforcement and a dive team.

Officers provide Search and Rescue coordination for Mohave County.

DETECTIVE DIVISION - is responsible for the investigation of all major crimes occurring in the unincorporated areas of Mohave County. This includes fraud, arson, crimes against children and

homicide. These responsibilities encompass crime scene investigation, scene reconstruction, interviewing and apprehension of suspects. They also provide assistance and follow up for the Mohave County Attorney in the prosecution of cases.

In addition, the crime scene/evidence technician maintains a fully equipped mobile crime lab for crime scene processing and evidence collection. The crime scene/evidence technician also handles all photography, latent print development on evidentiary items and latent fingerprint comparison.

RECORDS CENTER - is responsible for processing and storage of all Sheriff's Office reports and booking records and distributes reports to the public and law enforcement agencies as requested.

DISPATCH CENTER - receives incoming phone calls, 9-1-1- calls, and dispatches calls for service to field units.

CIVIL DIVISION - duties relate to the service of civil process, civil enforcement for the courts and collection of delinquent property taxes.

CORRECTIONS DIVISION - houses all city and county prisoners in a 210 bed jail facility in Kingman with holding facilities in Desert Hills, Mohave Valley and the Kingman Jail Annex.

SHOCK UNIT - is an intensive corrections program designed to rehabilitate nonviolent offenders. The program teaches discipline, work skills and academic achievement. They offer both adult and juvenile programs.

FLIGHT SERVICES - the Sheriff's Office maintains two fixed wing and one rotary wing aircraft for law enforcement air support, search and rescue, fugitive detail, and transportation of employees on Mohave County business.

K-9 UNIT - the Sheriff's Office manages four dogs and handlers trained in narcotics detection, accelerant detection and handler protection.

TACTICAL UNIT - The Tactical Operations Unit responds to high risk incidents such as hostage situations and barricaded armed subjects.







Meadview is located on the Grapevine Mesa 10 miles south of Lake Mead sitting just west of the Grand Wash Cliffs which define the end of the Grand Canyon. The elevation of 3500 feet allows cooler summer temperatures than the desert areas of Arizona. The air is clear and pure; the nighttime skies are filled with millions of stars.

Springtime brings a dense covering of wild flowers providing vibrant splashes of every shade of color. The mesa is home to a dense Joshua tree forest. The sunsets, which paint the Grand Wash Cliffs in pink, mauve and then magenta provide the perfect backdrop for a backyard cookout.

Come fish the quiet coves of the lake, ski on the wide open waters, take your boat miles up the Grand Canyon, into a different world. There's gold to find, rock hounding, gold mines to visit, swim in the clean water. 



Hoover Dam Bypass

It will be possibly sooner than 2007 that the 2,000 foot steel and concrete bridge that will be part of the Hoover Dam bypass will open.

On October 21, 2002 the governors of Nevada and Arizona, along with members of Congress and federal officials met during a ceremony to start working on the Hoover Dam bypass. The \$235 million dollar project starts with the relocation of two power lines and twelve electricity transmission towers presently blocking the path of the bridge.

Directions to Meadview from the east or the west

From Las Vegas, Nevada go east on highway 93 across Hoover Dam. On highway 93 turn north at mile post 42 on to Pierce Ferry Road and drive 40 miles to Meadview. About 100 miles from the Las Vegas Strip. Please note that at the present time there are some special regulations on traffic over Hoover Dam. For more information click on: Lake Mead NRA Advisory.

From Kingman, Arizona go west on highway 93. On highway 93 turn north at mile post 42 on to Pierce Ferry Road and drive 40 miles to Meadview. About 65 miles from downtown Kingman.

Pierce Ferry Road is county highway 25 and is paved the entire length. Watch out for cows on the road!

Where are we?

Meadview is located in north west Arizona at the point where the Grand Canyon ends and Lake Mead starts. At 3500 feet elevation Meadview enjoys summers a little cooler than

the low lying deserts and winters a little warmer than the mountain areas.

A little background information on Lake Mead, the Lake Mead Recreation Area and the Grapevine Mesa.

Lake Mead National Recreation Area:

Boating on Lake Mead is at its best at this end of the lake. Crystal clear water, fantastic scenery, miles of open water and clean beaches. Peace and solitude are yours for the asking - and the fishing is great.

Lake Mead National Recreation Area has over 3000 square miles of environmentally protected riparian scenery (according to the 1998 "Information Please" Almanac, Lake Mead is the largest National Recreational Area in the US with an acreage of almost 1½ million acres).

Beginning at the east border are the Grand Wash cliffs which rise to 6000 feet. The cliffs are the gateway for the Colorado River as it leaves the Grand Canyon and becomes Lake Mead. The lake is 115 miles long, terminating at Hoover Dam - the tallest dam in the Western Hemisphere. The dam rises 726.4 feet from bedrock to the paved road across this mile long concrete marvel.

Lake Mead is America's largest man made lake covering 229 square miles with a storage capacity of 30 million-acre feet of water. The 500 miles of shoreline changes dramatically from one area to the next with steep cliffs, deep coves, sandy beaches and always a vast panorama of photographic opportunities. The eastern end of the lake is famed for its fishing. Fish to be caught include striped bass which can reach monster sizes up to 60 pounds, large mouth bass, catfish and bluegill.

In the coves or on the cliffs that line the lake, you could see the majestic desert bighorn sheep. The rams are a

sturdy animals carrying massive curved horns and boasting large harems of ewes with their young. The wild burros, descendants of those left behind by discouraged prospectors, drink at the water's edge, as do cougars, bobcats and coyotes. Few nights pass without a serenade from a family of coyotes. Badgers, cottontails, and the wily black-eared jackrabbit, and even deer can be found within the park boundaries. Antelope are quite rare, but are seen occasionally.

Gambel's quail thrive in our area, sometimes numbering the hundreds as they search for seeds under the brush. In season, bird watchers can find over 250 species of birds ranging from 5 kinds of humming birds to the osprey, golden eagle, and even the bald eagle. There are 60 species of waterfowl including ducks, herons, brown pelicans, geese, coots, terns, and the small swan like billed grebe. Songbirds, owls, hawks, ravens and the turkey vulture are constant visitors to the area.

At Grapevine Springs you will find beds of the scarlet monkeyflower. The yellow wild columbine trails over the cliffs at Columbine Falls. Throughout the rest of the area you will find desert plants that survive our dry climate with only 6 inches of yearly moisture. This falls as rain during July and August, and again in February, but we have had snowfalls of 2 to 5 inches during the winter months on rare occasions.

The Grapevine Mesa

On the Grapevine Mesa the chaparral includes creosote bush, rabbit bush, cat claw, Joshua, yucca and large cholla, plus many flowering cactus.

The extensive Joshua forest that you drive through from highway 93 to Meadview is the largest of its kind in the United States and boasts some magnificent specimens of this unusual tree. For more information on the peculiarities of the Joshua Trees click on: [Joshua Trees](#)

You can visit the awesome beauty of the Grand Canyon on the Hualapai Indian Reservation and marvel at the Colorado River, far below, still carving the canyon ever deeper even as you watch. The beauties of the Canyon can be combined with a nice trip in a Conestoga wagon or horseback riding.

A VERY SHORT HISTORY OF THE AREA

The Grapevine Wash has long been well traveled and is known as the Ute trail from the Colorado River south to Hopi and across into California. In more recent history the Mormons used this trail to trek their trade wagons to the Hopi and Navajo villages.

In the 1820s Jedidiah Smith crossed the Virgin River, (Virgis as it was known then) and then across the Colorado to reach the California territory. In 1869 John Wesley Powell (1834-1902, geologist, explorer, and one-armed civil war veteran) led his band of explorers through the Grand Canyon past Pearce Ferry and South Cove and they ended their river trip where the Virgin enters the Colorado.

Boulder Dam was started in 1931 and finished in 1935. Over 90 men died during its construction. In 1953 the dam was renamed for Herbert Hoover who was president when it was originally conceived. Henry J. Kaiser, a

ship builder, was the contractor on the dam. The lake was named for Elwood Mead, commissioner for Reclamation in the early 1930s.

Hoover Dam traffic update

- ✧ Starting April 15, 2002, Recreational Vehicles will be allowed to cross Hoover Dam if the vehicles and contents can be "easily inspected" (whatever that means!). If an officer at the Dam's checkpoints believes any vehicle is a threat, that vehicle will not be allowed to cross.
- ✧ Boats cannot approach closer than one-half mile to the dam on the downstream (river) side and approximately one mile on the upstream (reservoir) side.

Bulletin dated September 8: Water level is extremely low. The park service has done some repair work at South Cove and the full width of the launch ramp can again be used. Pierce Ferry is closed for boat launching due to the low water. It is rumored that our water is being taken to fill reservoirs (Hemet?) in California (to water golf courses?). Of course there are still miles and miles of deep water in the lake and in the coves.

Jet Skis: The NPS has amended the regulations on "Personal Water Craft" from using Lake Mead and going up the Grand Canyon. Contact www.nps.gov/lame for more information. As of right now PWCs can be used on Lake Mead until April 10, 2003.

LMNRA Fee Schedule

Beginning in the summer of 2000 the National Park Service who control the Lake Mead National Recreation Area started charging entrance and lake use fees. The following is the question I put to the LMNRA in July, 2001, and their response;

Question to NPS: What is the situation regarding persons who bring boats to Meadview/South Cove/Pierce Ferry? Do they have to drive to Boulder City to get permits? Will they be cited if they don't have permits?

Answer from NPS: You can get a form from the Internet and mail it in to get your permits. The rangers are not going to cite you for not having an entrance sticker since there is not an entrance station in your area but you will get cited for not have (sic) a lake use sticker on your boat. Our Internet address is: www.nps.gov/lame, or you can send your mailing address and I can mail a form out to you.

It is my understanding that if you have the appropriate paperwork filled out and cash or check on hand, you can pay the Park Ranger if you are stopped. I am not guaranteeing this information! Dennis.
