Subject: Adjustment to the National Table of Frequency Allocations – Footnotes G122 and G123

Dear Mr. Franca:

Because Footnotes G122 and G123 both permit federal operations on a non-interference basis and because the history of the reallocation of these bands no longer needs to be presented in the footnotes, I propose to combine these footnotes as shown below. I also propose to combine the 2400-2402 MHz and 2402-2417 MHz bands into one band (i.e., 2400-2417 MHz band) in our National Table of Frequency Allocations. Last, I propose to align the text with other footnotes by using the terminology – “federal” and “non-federal” in place of “government” and “non-government” and by using the phrase – “shall not constrain” instead of “shall not hinder”.

G122: In the bands 2300-2310, 2395-2400 MHz, 2400-2417 MHz, and 4940-4990 MHz, federal operations may be authorized on a non-interference basis to authorized non-federal operations, and shall not constrain the implementation of any non-federal operations.

Footnote G123 can be suppressed.
