

- 1) The following areas in the Closed Captioning of TV programs are needed:  
Completion of captions when ads starts. Often the captions are incomplete when the program changes to ads.
- 2) Emergency, weather, or other announcements often cover the captions. Relocate either the captions or the announcement to a different line.
- 3) Captions some times don't appear until after the program has run for a few minutes.
- 4) many ads are not captioned
- 5) Voice warning or voice emergency announcements are not captioned.
- 6) Often old movies or classics are not captioned
- 7) captions are often misspelled and usually those who can sound out the misspelled word or and has good command of the English language can decipher the meaning. And in any case, in the processing of the meaning leads to losing track of the program. Others would have a hard time figuring out the meaning.
- 8) Many national or state news station will not have captions when local weather local news come on. So I'd be watching the news with captions and then the weatherman in town would appear and there would be no captions.
- 9) I've come accross CNN programs that are not captioned on week-ends.
