Acknowledgement Requirement – WC Docket No. 05-196**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

Pursuant to the *Public Notice* released on October 31, 2005 (DA 05-2874) entitled *Enforcement Bureau Provides Additional Guidance to Interconnected Voice Over Internet Protocol Service providers Concerning Enforcement of Subscriber Acknowledgement Requirement, WC Docket No 04-36, WC Docket No. 05-196*, US LEC Acquisition Co. ("US LEC") submits this additional status report as to its efforts to obtain subscriber acknowledgements from 100% of its subscribers.

In its October 25, 2005 status report, US LEC disclosed that as of October 24, 2005, 85.4% of its subscribers had affirmatively acknowledged of the 911 disclosure provided to all US LEC VoIP subscribers in compliance with the FCC's rules. On September 22, 2005, US LEC initiated a direct calling campaign directed to all subscribers that had not returned the affirmative acknowledgement. Despite these best efforts to obtain these remaining affirmative acknowledgments, US LEC has been unable to obtain any of the remaining acknowledgements. Currently, the subscribers that did not return the affirmative acknowledgement have had their service disabled. US LEC has received no inquiries from these subscribers seeking to have the service restored. As indicated, US LEC believes that the VoIP service was not a primary line service for these subscribers and, thus, the subscribers did not take the initiative to respond to US LEC or seek to have the service restored.

Accordingly, US LEC has obtained 100% of the affirmative acknowledgements from subscribers that are actively able to use the US LEC VoiceEclipse™ services.
