Sirs/Mdms:

It is not necessary to attempt to apply smoke and mirrors to the results of comments either for or against NPRM 02-235. The statistics show that of the Amateurs that commented, very nearly 55% favored retention of telegraphy testing in some form.

Assuredly, Mr. Anderson applied no creative logic when he first presented the numbers in favor of his position on August 11, 2005. In fact, the same telegraphy testing opponents who pointed to Mr. Anderson's first numbers with glee, were soon digging deep in their magic bag to explain away the final count, with the exception of Mr. Anderson of course.

The need for compromise from both sides was never more apparant than now, nor could it ever be made so clear to the Commission than by these comments. Whatever the Commission decides, you have been informed that 55% of Amateurs responding want the test to remain. We must trust you will do the right thing and retain the telegraphy test for the Extra Class License at the least.
