- Upon review of the appeal and its relevant documentation, it was determined that you were asked to provide documentation or LOAs, establishing the authority for BOCES to procure services and products on behalf of its members. You were also informed that the documentation or LOAs must describe the type(s) of service(s) that the consortium is authorized to apply for. The LOAs that you provided did not specify that BOCES had authorization to procure the Internet Access (eChalk) service that you requested, which is a violation of program rules. In your appeal letter, you contend that this was merely a clerical error and oversight and have argued that BOCES is authorized to apply for these services as per New York State law. Program rules do not permit the SLD to accept new information on appeal except where an applicant was not given an opportunity to provide information during the initial review or an error was made by SLD.
- During the Program Integrity Assurance review of your Form 471 application you were asked to provide evidence of your authority to file Forms 471 on behalf of, or evidence of the membership of, all the members included in the consortium. SLD denied your application because you failed to provide proof of your authorization to represent all entities for which services were sought and/or proof of their membership in the consortium. In your appeal, you did not show that the SLD's determination was incorrect. Consequently, your appeal is denied.
- You failed to provide evidence of your authority to file FCC Forms 471 on behalf of, or evidence of, the membership of all the members included in this consortium. FCC rules require that the Form 471 shall be signed by the person authorized to order telecommunications and other supported services for the eligible schools or libraries or the consortium. The Form 471 shall include that person's various certifications under oath, submitted on behalf of eligible entities applying for discounts. 47 C.F.R. § 54.504 (c)(1). During the course of the application review, the SLD may seek documentation to confirm the consortium leader's authorization to represent all entities in the application, proof of each entity's membership in the consortium and their knowledge of filing of the applicable Form (s) 471 on their behalf. See Instructions for Completing the Schools and Libraries Universal Service , Services Ordered and Certification Form (FCC Form 471), OMB 3060-0806 (October 2002) at Item 33.

If your appeal has been approved, but funding has been reduced or denied, you may appeal these decisions to either the SLD or the FCC. After thorough review and investigation of all relevant facts, the Schools and Libraries Division (SLD) of the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) has made its decision in regard to your appeal of SLD's Funding Year 2004 Funding Commitment Decision Letter for the Application Number indicated above. This letter explains the basis of SLD's decision. The date of this letter begins the 60-day time period for appealing this decision to the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). If your Letter of Appeal included more than one Application Number, please note that you will receive a separate letter for each application.

Funding Request Number(s): 1144427
Decision on Appeal: **Denied**
Explanation:

- You are appealing the SLD's decision to deny this funding request on the grounds that the Letter of Agency ("LOA") that you provided did not specify that the Southern Westchester Board of Cooperative Educational Services ("SW BOCES") had the authority for purchasing Internet Access on behalf of the named districts. You contend that SW BOCES does not require LOAs, because its authority was established by New York State law. You also claim that Internet Access was not specified on the LOAs due to a clerical error or oversight. You are requesting that the SLD decision be reversed because each member school district fully intended its LOA to cover eChalk service to include email services and Web hosting. You have included e-mail, calendared meetings, and notes in support of your appeal.

- Upon review of the appeal and its relevant documentation, it was determined that you were asked to provide documentation or LOAs, establishing the authority for BOCES to procure services and products on behalf of its members. You were also informed that the documentation or LOAs must describe the type(s) of service(s) that the consortium is authorized to apply for. The LOAs that you provided did not specify that BOCES had authorization to procure the Internet Access (eChalk) service that you requested, which is a violation of program rules. In your appeal letter, you contend that this was merely a clerical error and oversight and have argued that BOCES is authorized to apply for these services as per New York State law.
