Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Tuesday, December 6, 2005, Lawrence Krevor, Vice President, Government Affairs – Spectrum, Sprint Nextel Corporation (“Sprint Nextel”) met with Barry Ohlson, Senior Legal Advisor to Commissioner Jonathan Adelstein, to discuss issues raised during the reconsideration stage of the above-captioned proceeding regarding the Broadband Radio Service (“BRS”) and Educational Broadband Service (“EBS”) at 2.5 GHz. In particular, Mr. Krevor pointed out that a Commission decision to limit EBS lease terms to a maximum of fifteen years could discourage commercial investment and undercut the reconfiguration of the 2.5 GHz band, as well as unduly limit EBS licensees’ options as they pursue their educational mission.

Pursuant to section 1.1206(b)(2) of the Commission’s rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206(b)(2), this letter is being filed electronically for inclusion in the public record of the above-referenced proceeding.
