

I am opposed to RM 11306.

Segregation by bandwidth in today's amateur radio spectrum is not required.

A quick listen to the airwaves would show that we have about - CW~30%, Digital (all types) ~ 10%, and Phone ~ 60%. Take those numbers along with the fact that the amateur radio population is decreasing in size because of newer forms of communication (I.E. internet, cell phones, etc etc ) and I have to ask where do we need to impose these new rules and for what purpose?

The amateur radio community has performed well in a "self regulated" stature for years. In order to regulate the proposal by bandwidth we would have to take " self regulation" out of the amateur communities hands and turn it over to the FCC who has the sophisticated equipment to monitor the new proposed standards.

How would enforcement of this proposal impact the FCC and its funding to do so? Is the FCC up to this new burden? Does the FCC have the time to deal with this?

It is obvious that this proposal was not designed in amateur radios best interest but for the ARRLs monetary interest. Deregulation would be a better answer than this for all parties involved .

I ask that the FCC, who would ultimately have to enforce this proposal, to reject this concept and proposal at this time.
