Dear Ms. Dortch:

During an informal meeting with Chairman Martin on January 10, 2003, Media Access Project President and CEO Andrew Jay Schwartzman discussed the pending Adelphia cable proceeding.

In addition to reiterating several arguments which are contained in pleadings on file with the Commission, Mr. Schwartzman expressed the view that most of the asserted public interest benefits of the proposed transaction do not apply to the issue of whether the Commission should approve the transfer or "swap" of cable systems not presently owned by Adelphia. Mr. Schwartzman said that the Commission should consider the transfer of those systems separately and that the Commission would need independent public interest justifications for the approval of those systems. He expressed the view that this might require revisions to the contract among the parties, including provisions relating to the "unwinding" of the Time Warner Entertainment, LLP partnership, but that this was not an insuperable obstacle to such agency action.
