## WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATIONS BUREAU ACTION

### COMMENTS INVITED ON THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, MARYLAND AND NORTHERN VIRGINIA (REGION 20) 800 MHz REGIONAL PLANNING COMMITTEE PUBLIC SAFETY PLAN AMENDMENT

(GEN. DOCKET NO. 90-7)

On December 20, 2004, Region 20 (District of Columbia, Maryland and Northern Virginia)<sup>1</sup> 821 MHz Regional Planning Committee submitted a proposed amendment<sup>2</sup> to its Public Safety Plan (Plan) that would revise the current channel assignments to reflect the following changes: (a) Revised Frequency Assignment Table as a result of its fourth window (Window 4A) application process; (b) modification of operating parameters of existing channels in Fairfax County, Virginia, and (c) completion of required adjacent region concurrence on channel assignments for Carroll and Charles Counties, Maryland; Fauquier and Loudoun Counties, Virginia; and the Upper Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) – Queen Anne's, Talbot and Caroline Counties.<sup>3</sup>

The proposed Plan Amendment was reviewed by, and letters of concurrence obtained from, Region 20's adjacent regions, Region 28 (Eastern Pennsylvania, Southern New Jersey and Delaware),<sup>4</sup> Region 36 (Western Pennsylvania),<sup>5</sup> Region 42 (Virginia) and Region 44 (West Virginia).

In accordance with the National Public Safety Plan, each region is responsible for planning its use of public safety radio frequency spectrum in the 821-824/866-869 MHz bands.<sup>6</sup> The Public Safety Plan for Region 20, was originally adopted by the Commission in March 1990, and has been amended several times.<sup>7</sup>

Prior to taking action on the Region 20 Plan Amendment, by this Public Notice, we solicit comments on the Plan Amendment. Pursuant to Sections 1.415 and 1.419 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 1.415, 1.419, interested parties may file comments on or before January 30, 2006, and reply comments on or before February 14, 2006. All comments should reference General Docket 90-7, and should be filed with the Office of the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission, 445 12<sup>th</sup> Street, S.W., TW-A325, Washington, D.C. 20554.<sup>8</sup>
